Dear Mr. Bianculli:

Enclosed is Permit Number 0830166-002-AO to operate the above-referenced source issued pursuant to Section(s) 403.087, Florida Statutes.

A person whose substantial interests are affected by this permit may petition for an administrative proceeding (hearing) in accordance with Section 120.57, Florida Statutes. The petition must contain the information set forth below and must be filed (received) in the Office of General Counsel of the Department at 3900 Commonwealth Boulevard, Mail Station 35, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-3000, within 14 days of receipt of this Permit. Petitioner shall mail a copy of the petition to the applicant at the address indicated above at the time of filing. Failure to file a petition within this time period shall constitute a waiver of any right such person may have to request an administrative determination (hearing) under Section 120.57, Florida Statutes.

The petition shall contain the following information; (a) the name, address, and telephone number of each petitioner, the applicant's name and address, the Department permit file number and the county in which the project is proposed; (b) a statement of how and when each petitioner received notice of the Department's action or proposed action; (c) a statement of how each petitioner's substantial interests are affected by the Department's action or proposed action; (d) a statement of the material facts disputed by petitioner, if any; (e) a statement of facts which petitioner contends warrant reversal or modification of the Department's action or proposed action; (f) a statement of which rules or statutes petitioner contends require reversal or modification of the Department's action or proposed action; and (g) a statement of the relief sought by petitioner, stating precisely the action petitioner wants the Department to take with respect to the Department's action or proposed action.


If a petition is filed, the administrative hearing process is designed to formulate agency action. Accordingly, the Department's final action may be different from the position taken by it in this permit. Persons whose substantial interests will be affected by any decision of the Department with regard to the application have the right to petition to become a party to the proceeding. The petition must conform to the requirements specified above and be filed (received) within 14 days of receipt of this notice in the Office of General Counsel at the above address of the Department. Failure to petition within the allowed time frame constitutes a waiver of any right such person has to request a hearing under Section 120.57, F.S., and to participate as a party to this proceeding. Any subsequent intervention will only be at the approval of the presiding officer upon motion filed pursuant to Rule 28-5.207, F.A.C.

This permit is final and effective on the date filed with the Clerk of the Department unless a petition is filed in accordance with the above paragraphs or unless a request for extension of time in which to file a petition is filed within the time specified for filing a petition and conforms to Rule 62-103.070, F.A.C. Upon timely filing of a petition or a request for an extension of time this permit will not be effective until further Order of the Department.

When the Order (Permit) is final, any party to the Order has the right to seek judicial review of the Order pursuant to Section 120.68, Florida Statutes, by the filing of a Notice of Appeal pursuant to Rule 9.110, Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure, with the Clerk of the Department in the Office of General Counsel, 3900 Commonwealth Boulevard, Mail Station 35, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-3000; and by filing a copy of the Notice of Appeal accompanied by the applicable filing fees with the appropriate District Court of Appeal. The Notice of Appeal must be filed within 30 days from the date the Final Order is filed with the Clerk of the Department.

This permit is issued under the provisions of Chapter(s) 403, F.S., and Florida Administrative Code Rule(s) 62-210. The above named permittee is hereby authorized to perform the work or operate the facility shown on the application and approved drawing(s), plans, and other documents attached hereto or on file with the Department and made a part hereof and specifically described as follows:

The permittee may operate a scrap metal (automobile and sheet metal) shredder with separation and conveyor systems. The shredder is a Harris Model HS80115 Heavy Duty Hammer Mill Shredder, which receives various recyclable materials such as, but not limited to, metal clips, loose scrap, appliances and automobile bodies (including motor blocks and transmissions drained of fluids) at a rate of 70 to 100 tons per hour. The shredder is Emission Unit 001, and the Separation and Conveyor Systems is Emission Unit 002. Fugitive particulate emissions are emitted from both emission units. Water is injected into the shredder to help control particulate emissions.

A cyclone separator is used for fluff separation, and is considered to be process equipment used for recovery and control. The cyclone separator is a closed loop system without a stack discharge.

The facility is located at 2020 N.W. 31st Street, Ocala, Marion County, Florida.

GENERAL CONDITIONS:

1. The terms, conditions, requirements, limitations and restrictions set forth in this permit, are "permit conditions" and are binding and enforceable pursuant to Sections 403.141, 403.727, or 403.859 through 403.861, Florida Statutes (F.S.). The permittee is placed on notice that the Department will review this permit periodically and may initiate enforcement action for any violation of these conditions.
2. This permit is valid only for the specific processes and operations applied for and indicated in the approved drawings or exhibits. Any unauthorized deviation from the approved drawings, exhibits, specifications, or conditions of this permit may constitute grounds for revocation and enforcement action by the Department.
3. As provided in subsections 403.087(6) and 403.722(5), F.S., the issuance of this permit does not convey any vested rights or any exclusive privileges. Neither does it authorize any injury to public or private property or any invasion of personal rights, nor any infringement of federal, state, or local laws or regulations. This permit is not a waiver of or approval of any other Department permit that may be required for other aspects of the total project which are not addressed in this permit.
4. This permit conveys no title to land or water, does not constitute State recognition or acknowledgment of title, and does not constitute authority for the use of submerged lands unless herein provided and the necessary title or leasehold interests have been obtained from the State. Only the Trustees of the Internal Improvement Trust Fund may express State opinion as to title.
5. This permit does not relieve the permittee from liability for harm or injury to human health or welfare, animal, or plant life, or property caused by the construction or operation of this permitted source, or from penalties therefore; nor does it allow the permittee to cause pollution in contravention of Florida Statutes and Department rules, unless specifically authorized by an order from the Department.
6. The permittee shall properly operate and maintain the facility and systems of treatment and control (and related appurtenances) that are installed and used by the permittee to achieve compliance with the conditions of this permit, as required by Department rules. This provision includes the operation of backup and auxiliary facilities or similar systems when necessary to achieve compliance with the conditions of the permit and when required by Department rules.
7. The permittee, by accepting this permit, specifically agrees to allow authorized Department personnel, upon presentation of credentials or other documents as may be required by law and at reasonable times, access to the premises where the permitted activity is located or conducted to:
 - (a) Have access to and copy any records that must be kept under conditions of this permit;
 - (b) Inspect the facility, equipment, practices, or operations regulated or required under this permit; and
 - (c) Sample or monitor any substances or parameters at any location reasonably necessary to assure compliance with this permit or Department rules.

Reasonable time may depend on the nature of the concern being investigated.

8. If, for any reason, the permittee does not comply with or will be unable to comply with any condition or limitation specified in this permit, the permittee shall immediately provide the Department with the following information:
 - (a) A description of and cause of noncompliance; and
 - (b) The period of noncompliance, including dates and times; or, if not corrected, the anticipated time the noncompliance is expected to continue, and steps being taken to reduce, eliminate, and prevent recurrence of the noncompliance.

The permittee shall be responsible for any and all damages which may result and may be subject to enforcement action by the Department for penalties or for revocation of this permit.

GENERAL CONDITIONS:

9. In accepting this permit, the permittee understands and agrees that all records, notes, monitoring data and other information relating to the construction or operation of this permitted source which are submitted to the Department may be used by the Department as evidence in any enforcement case involving the permitted source arising under the Florida Statutes or Department rules, except where such use is prescribed by Section 403.111 and 403.73, F.S. Such evidence shall only be used to the extent it is consistent with the Florida Rules of Civil Procedure and appropriate evidentiary rules.
10. The permittee agrees to comply with changes in Department rules and Florida Statutes after a reasonable time for compliance; provided, however, the permittee does not waive any other rights granted by Florida Statutes or Department rules.
11. This permit is transferable only upon Department approval in accordance with Rules 62-4.120 and 62-730.300, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.), as applicable. The permittee shall be liable for any non-compliance of the permitted activity until the transfer is approved by the Department.
12. This permit or a copy thereof shall be kept at the work site of the permitted activity.
13. This permit also constitutes:
 - () Determination of Best Available Control Technology (BACT)
 - () Determination of Prevention of Significant Deterioration (PSD)
 - () Certification of compliance with State Water Quality Standards (Section 401, PL 92-500)
 - () Compliance with New Source Performance Standards
14. The permittee shall comply with the following:
 - (a) Upon request, the permittee shall furnish all records and plans required under Department rules. During enforcement actions, the retention period for all records will be extended automatically unless otherwise stipulated by the Department.
 - (b) The permittee shall hold at the facility or other location designated by this permit records of all monitoring information (including all calibration and maintenance records and all original strip chart recordings for continuous monitoring information) required by the permit, copies of all reports required by this permit, and records of all data used to complete the application for this permit. These materials shall be retained at least three years from the date of the sample, measurement, report, or application unless otherwise specified by Department rule.
 - (c) Records of monitoring information shall include:
 1. The date, exact place, and time of sampling or measurements;
 2. The person responsible for performing the sampling or measurements;
 3. The dates analyses were performed;
 4. The person responsible for performing the analyses;
 5. The analytical techniques or methods used;
 6. The results of such analyses.
15. When requested by the Department, the permittee shall within a reasonable time furnish any information required by law which is needed to determine compliance with the permit. If the permittee becomes aware the relevant facts were not submitted or were incorrect in the permit application or in any report to the Department, such facts or information shall be corrected promptly.

SPECIFIC CONDITIONS:

OPERATING CONDITIONS

1. The facility is permitted to operate continuously.
[Rule 62-210.200, Potential to Emit (PTE), F.A.C.]
2. The maximum permitted operating rate is 876,000 tons of metal to the shredder per consecutive 12-months period.
[Rule 62-210.200, Potential to Emit (PTE), F.A.C.]
3. No person shall circumvent any pollution control device or allow the emissions of air pollutants without the applicable air pollution control device operating properly. This includes equipment, such as spray nozzles and pipes, needed to allow for the flow of water injection spray into the scrap metal shredder.
[Rule 62-210.650, F.A.C.]
4. The system at the shredder will operate only under wet conditions. At the separation, conveying, and drop points, the system will operate under wet and/or dry conditions.

5. The cyclone system separator (including the cyclone), which is considered process equipment used for recovery and control, shall be maintained in good working order.
[Rule 62-4.070(3), F.A.C.]

EMISSION LIMITS

6. No person shall cause, suffer, allow or permit the discharge of air pollutants which cause or contribute to an objectionable odor. An objectionable odor is defined as any odor present in the outdoor atmosphere which by itself or in combination with other odors, is or may be harmful or injurious to human health or welfare, which unreasonably interferes with the comfortable use and enjoyment of life or property, or which creates a nuisance.
[Rule 62-296.320(2), F.A.C.]
7. No person shall cause, let, permit, suffer, or allow the emissions of unconfined particulate matter from any activity, including vehicular movement; transportation of materials; construction, alteration, demolition or wrecking; or industrially related activities such as loading, unloading, storing or handling, without taking reasonable precautions to prevent such emission. The area must be watered down should unconfined emissions occur.
[Rules 62-296.320(4)(c)1. and 62-296.320(4)(c)2., F.A.C.]
8. Visible emissions from the facility must comply with Rule 62-296.320(4)(b)1., F.A.C., and are limited to less than 20 percent opacity.
[Rule 62-296.320(4)(b)1., F.A.C.]

SPECIFIC CONDITIONS:

COMPLIANCE TESTING

9. The shredder, conveyor and separation systems shall be tested for visible emissions in accordance with DEP Method 9 at least 60 days prior to this operation permit expiration date. The DEP Method 9 test shall last 30 minutes under conditions that would be expected to yield the highest opacity value.
[Rules 62-297.310(7)(a)3. and 62-297.310(4)(a)2., F.A.C.]
10. At least 15 days prior to the date on which each formal compliance test is due to begin, the permittee shall provide written notification of the test to the air compliance section of this office. The notification must include the following information: the date, time, and location of each test; the name and telephone number of the facility's contact person who will be responsible for coordinating the test; and the name, company, and telephone number of the person conducting the test.
[Rule 62-297.310(7)(a)9., F.A.C.]
11. Testing of emissions shall be conducted with the emissions unit operation at permitted capacity. The maximum operating rate is 100 tons/hour throughput rate of scrap metal to the shredder. Permitted capacity is defined as 90 to 100 percent of the maximum operation rate allowed by the permit. If it is impractical to test at permitted capacity, subsequent emissions unit operation is limited to 110 percent of the test load until a new test is conducted. Once the unit is so limited, operation at higher capacities is allowed for no more than 15 consecutive days for the purpose of additional compliance testing to regain the authority to operate at the permitted capacity.

RECORDKEEPING AND DOCUMENT SUBMITTAL

12. The owner or operator shall submit a copy of the compliance test results to the air compliance section of this office within 45 days after the last sampling run of each test is completed.
[Rule 62-297.310(8)(b), F.A.C.]
13. In order to demonstrate compliance with specific condition number 2, the permittee shall maintain a log at the facility for a period of at least 5 years from the date the data is recorded. The log at a minimum shall contain the following:
Monthly
 - a) designation of the month and year of operation for which the records are being tabulated.
 - b) consecutive twelve (12) months total of metal to the shredder (tons)
 - c) one month total of metal to the shredder (tons).
 - d) number of operational hours per day.
[Rule 62-4.070(3), F.A.C.]

Note: A consecutive 12-month total is equal to the total for the month in question plus the totals for the eleven months previous to the month in question. A consecutive 12-month total treats each month of the year as the end of a 12-month period. A 12-month total is not a year-to-date total. Facilities that have not been operating for 12-months should retain 12 month totals using whatever number of months of data are available until such a time as a consecutive 12 month-total can be maintained each month. Monthly logs shall be completed by the end of the following month.


SPECIFIC CONDITIONS:

- 14. The owner or operator shall complete DEP Form No. 62-210.900(5), F.A.C., "Annual Operating Report for Air Pollutant Emitting Facility," for each calendar year and submit it either electronically using the latest Department Annual Operating Report software or by hard copy to the air compliance section of this office on or before March 1 of the following year in accordance with Rule 62-210.370(3), F.A.C. The emissions shall be computed in accordance with the provisions of Rule 62-210.370(2), F.A.C., for the purposes of the annual operating report.

PERMIT APPLICATION

- 15. At least sixty days prior to the expiration date of this operation permit, the permittee shall submit to this office four air permit applications, DEP Form No. 62-210.900(4), along with the processing fee established in 62-4.050(4), F.A.C.
