This permit is issued under the provisions of Section 403.087, Florida Statutes, and Florida Administrative Code Rules 17-296, 17-297 and 17-4. The above named applicant, hereinafter called Permittee, is hereby authorized to perform the work or operate the facility shown on the application and approved drawing(s), plans, and other documents attached hereto or on file with the Department and made a part hereof and specifically described as follows:

This after-the-fact construction permit for an existing Methanol Storage Tank. The existing fixed-roof tank was originally constructed in November 1993 and has a 38,500 gallon capacity. Maximum annual throughput is 240,000 gallons per year. This tank shall be in compliance with Title 40, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 60, Subpart Kb, Standards of Performance for Volatile Organic Liquid Storage Vessels (including Petroleum Liquid Storage Vessels). Methanol emissions from the tank is estimated to be 0.84 tons per year. Methanol is a volatile organic liquid and a Hazardous Air Pollutant.

Located at 1 Everitt Avenue, Parker, Bay County.

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SPECIFIC CONDITIONS:

General

1. The attached General Conditions are part of this permit. [FAC Rule 17-4.160]

Construction

2. This is an after-the-fact construction permit for a 38,500 gallon capacity methanol storage tank put into service in 1993. Stone Container Corporation discovered that the tank is subject to NSPS, 40 CFR 60, Subpart Kb.

Operation

3. All requirements of Title 40, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 60, Subpart Kb (40 CFR 60 Kb), Standards of Performance for Volatile Organic Liquid Storage Vessels (including Petroleum Liquid Storage Vessels) applicable to this source shall be adhered to. Specifically records showing the dimensions of the tank, analysis showing the capacity of the tank, the volatile organic liquid (VOL) stored, period of storage, and maximum true vapor pressure of the VOL for the life of the methanol tank. All records shall be kept for at least two years. The Department shall be notified within thirty days when the true vapor pressure of the liquid exceeds 4.0 psi. [40CFR 60.116]

4. The permittee shall maintain records for all stored materials which show the annual throughput and emissions for the methanol storage tank. [FAC Rule 17-4.070]

5. VOC emissions shall be controlled by limiting the maximum throughput of methanol through the tank to 240,000 gallons per year. [FAC Rule 17-4.070]

6. The manner, nature, volume and frequency of permitted emissions, applicable emissions limiting standards (if any) and allowable emissions are listed as per FAC Rule 17-210.300(2)(a):

Administrative

7. The permittee shall include this source as part of the facility application for a Title V operation permit [FAC Rule 17-4.050]

8. In accordance with F.A.C. Rule 17-213, a Major Air Pollution Source Annual Operation Fee Form [DEP Form 17-213.900(11) attached] must be completed and submitted with appropriate fee between January 15 and March 1 of each year. If the Department has not received the fee payment by March 1, the Department shall impose, in addition to the fee, a penalty of 50 percent of the amount of the fee, plus interest on such amount computed in accordance with s.220.807, Florida Statutes. The Department may revoke any major air pollution source operation permit if it finds that the permit holder has failed to pay timely and required annual operation license fee, penalty or interest. The attached form shall be reproduced by the permittee and used for future annual submittals. The completed form and appropriate fees must be submitted to the Department of Environmental Protection, Title V Annual Emissions Fee, Cashiers Office, Bureau of Finance and Accounting, P. O. Box 3070, Tallahassee, FL 32315-3070.

We recommend issuing an Intent to Issue with public notice for an after-the-fact construction permit to Stone Container Corporation for an existing Methanol Storage Tank.

NOTICE OF INTENT TO ISSUE PERMIT

The Department of Environmental Protection gives notice of its intent to issue an after-the-fact construction permit to Stone Container Corporation, for a 38,500 gallon capacity methanol storage tank. The tank emits 0.84 tons per year of VOCs which is limited by capping the throughput to 240,000 gallons per year. This tank shall be in compliance with Title 40, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 60, Subpart Kb, Standards of Performance for Volatile Organic Liquid Storage Vessels.

A person whose substantial interests are affected by the Department's proposed permitting decision may petition for an administrative proceeding (hearing) in accordance with Section 120.57, Florida Statutes. The petition must contain the information set forth below and must be filed (received) in the Office of General Counsel of the Department at 2600 Blair Stone Road, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-2400, within 21 days of publication of this notice. Petitioner shall mail a copy of the petition to the applicant at the address indicated above at the time of filing. Failure to file a petition within this time period shall constitute a waiver of any right such person may have to request an administrative determination (hearing) under Section 120.57, Florida Statutes.

The petition shall contain the following information; (a) The name, address, and telephone number of each petitioner, the applicant's name and address, the Department Permit File Number and the county in which the project is proposed; (b) A statement of how and when each petitioner received notice of the Department's action or proposed action; (c) A statement of how each petitioner's substantial interests are affected by the Department's action or proposed action; (d) A statement of the material facts disputed by petitioner, if any; (e) A statement of facts which petitioner contends warrant reversal or modification of the Department's action or proposed action; (f) A statement of which rules or statutes petitioner contends require reversal or modification of the Department's action or proposed action; and (g) A statement of the relief sought by petitioner, stating precisely the action petitioner wants the Department to take with respect to the Department's action or proposed action.

If a petition is filed, the administrative hearing process is designed to formulate agency action. Accordingly, the Department's final action may be different from the position taken by it in this Notice. Persons whose substantial interests will be affected by any decision of the Department with regard to the application have the right to petition to become a party to the proceeding. The petition must conform to the requirements specified above and be filed (received) within 21 days of publication of this notice in the Office of General Counsel at the above address of the Department. Failure to petition within the allowed time frame constitutes a waiver of any right such person has to request a hearing under Section 120.57, Florida Statutes, and to participate as a party to this proceeding. Any subsequent intervention will only be at the approval of the presiding officer upon motion filed pursuant to Rule 28-5.207, F.A.C.

The application is available for public inspection during normal business hours, 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, except for legal holidays, at the Northwest District, 160 Governmental Center, Pensacola, Florida.
