Enclosed is the final permit for construction activities at the BP Port Everglades Terminal facility located in Broward County at 1180 Spangler Road, Fort Lauderdale, Florida 33316. This construction permit is issued pursuant to Section 403.087 of the Florida Statutes, Broward County's Specific Operating Agreement with the Florida Department of Environmental Protection, and Broward County Code Chapter 27 Article IV which adopts Florida Administrative Code (FAC) 62-4, 62-204, 62-210, 62-296 and 62-297.

Persons whose substantial interests are affected by this permit have a right, pursuant to Section 120.57, Florida Statutes, to petition for an administrative determination (hearing) on it. The petition must conform to the requirements of Chapters 62-103 and 28-5.201, FAC, and must be filed (received) in the Clerk of the PPD in the legal office (Office of The Broward County Attorney at 115 S. Andrews Avenue, Suite 423, Fort Lauderdale, Florida 33301-1872) within 14 days of receipt of this notice. Failure to file a petition within the 14 days constitutes a waiver of any right such person has to an administrative determination (hearing) pursuant to Section 120.57, Florida Statutes and Chapter 27.

This permit is final and effective on the date filed with the Clerk of the Pollution Prevention Division (PPD) unless a petition is filed in accordance with this paragraph or unless a request for extension of time in which to file a petition is filed within the time specified for filing a petition and conforms to Rule 62-103.070, FAC. Upon timely filing of a petition or a request for an extension of time, this permit will not be effective until further Order of the PPD. When the Order (Permit) is final, any party to the Order has the right to seek judicial review of the Order pursuant to Section 120.68, Florida Statutes, by the filing of a Notice of Appeal pursuant to Rule 9.110, Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure, with the Clerk of the PPD in the legal office; and by filing a copy of the Notice of Appeal accompanied by the applicable filing fees with the appropriate District Court of Appeal. The Notice of Appeal must be filed within 30 days from the date the Final Order is filed with the Clerk of the PPD in the legal office.

Project

Permit No. 0110051-015-AC is for the following activities at the BP Port Everglades Terminal located at 1180 Spangler Road, Fort Lauderdale, Florida 33316:

- (1) The replacement of the internal floating roofs of existing Tanks 11 and 12. The tanks will have new mechanical shoe primary, and new secondary wiper seals.
- (2) The addition of a new secondary wiper seal to Tank 7, and
- (3) Installation of fitting, valves, and blenders in Tanks 11 and 12 (while the tanks are empty) for future component blending operations.

Processing

July 26, 2012: Received application for a construction permit
September 17, 2012: Issued the Notice of Intent to Issue Air Permit.
October 4, 2012: The Public Notice was advertised in the Sun Sentinel newspaper.

Comments

No comments were received from the public during the 14-day public comment period.

Conclusion

The final action of the Department is to issue the permit.
