COMMENTS. On May 5, 2000 Department personnal condu	ucted an unannounced annual air compliance inspection of BFI Waste	

COMMENTS: On May 5, 2009 Department personnel conducted an unannounced annual air compliance inspection of BFI Waste Systems located in Escambia County. Mr. Steve Gonser, Maintenance Manager, was on site to assist during the inspection.

Mr. Gonser led a tour of the facility and described the operations. Items being painted at the facility include waste containers and trucks. Only water-based paints are used in an airless sprayer. Prior to painting, the surfaces are sanded using a wire wheel.

Mr. Gonser inspects the facility on a monthly basis and has a checksheet that includes the condition of the paint booth, ventilation system, filters, containers and storage of combustible materials. The paint booth was missing some filters and the filters that were present were clogged with blue paint. No excessive overspray was noted inside or outside of the paint booth.

Records of the quantity of paint purchased each month were available for review. For the months of October 2008 through April

Records of the quantity of paint purchased each month were available for review. For the months of October 2008 through April 2009, 430 gallons of paint were purchased. The product specification sheet for the paints, which includes the amount of VOCs present, were also available for review.

The entitlement period for BFI Waste Systems ended on November 7, 2008. Rule 62-210.310(2)(c)2, F.A.C., states that to avoid a lapse of authority to operate, an owner or operator intending to use, or continue to use, an air general permit must submit the proper registration form and processing fee at least 30 days prior to expiration of the facility's existing air general permit.
