COMMENTS: ON October 18, 2007 I WENT TO THIS FACILITY TO PERFORM THE ANNUAL COMPLIANCE INSPECTION. ON SITE I MET ARSIDES RODRIGUEZ, THE FACILITY'S PLANT MANAGER. THE FACILITY WAS NOT OPRATIONAL AT THE TIME OF THE INSPECTION. CONCRETE PRODUCTION IS APPROXAMITLY 350 YARDS PER DAY. STATE AND COUNTY PERMITS ARE UP TO DATE. THE FACILTY PRACTICES GOOD HOUSE KEEPING.
