COMMENTS: All records requested were available for inspection. Weekly bag-house inspections are performed. This facility only uses #2 diesel fuel and keeps fuel inventory records, however because they do not utilize off-road diesel they do not keep records of fuel sulfur content. The facility used approximately 3240 gallons of number 2 diesel and processed approximately 15,500 tons of material during the past year. No fugitive emissions were observed during this inspection. A VE test was performed on May 23, 2007 with a reported VE of 0%.
