**COMMENTS:** 1) Facility is operating without entitlement. The entitlement period expired May 6, 2010. At the time of the inspection Ms. Rodriguez provided documentation showing the the registration form was submitted to the Department by certified mail on June 9, 2010. The registration form was received by the Department on June 14, 2010 and is currently under the 30-day review process. 2) Ms. Rodrigues provided Ms. Owens with a perc purchase receipt from April 19, 2010, but indicated perc had also been purchased in February. Ms. Rodriguez was unable to produce the receipt from February and agreed to submit the receipt to the Department with seven (7) days of the inspection. 3) It was also noted during the inspection that the floor surrounding the perc machine was not rendered impervious to solvents. The floor was to be sealed within seven (7) days of the inspection. This facility has had a change in equipment. Per Ms. Rodriguez, the previous perc machine (Neil & Spencer) was removed by Danny Echt of One Stop Drycleaning Machinery in November 2009 and a new machine (Forenta MiraClean Series 345) was installed. The Forenta perc machine was obtained from Stroud Clenaers in Deland, FL. Ms. Rodriguez indicated the facility operated as drop store in 2008 and 2009. Full operation was restored in February 2010 with the installation of the new machine.
