**COMMENTS:** The facility's air general permit is expired and must be renewed for facility to continue operating. Owner was provided a copy of the PERC dry cleaning re-registration workbook to re-register and obtain a new permit either on-line or by mail. In inspecting the facility's records it was noted that for weekly temperature checks (the refrigerated condenser temperature) over the last several months, was not being recorded on the tracking calendar. Owner stated that they changed personnel recently who conduct the leak and temperature checks. Owner was informed that the temperatures must be recorded when checks are done as per the facility's permit conditions and DEP rule. A majority of the rolling PERC purchase totals were also not being calculated and recorded in the tracking calendar. A DEP calendar with this process explained was provided to the owner to show to personnel responsible for recording the PERC purchase totals. A PERC purchase annotation on the calendar was changed from Jan 2012 to Feb 2012 as this receipt was noted missing in the last inspection, but was it was determined the PERC was actually purchased in Feb 2012 not Jan 2012.
