**COMMENTS:** 1) Facility does not have a log of dates of when dry cleaning system components were inspected for leaks and could not provide documentation of leak detections being conducted. 2) Facility does not utilize a halogen leak detector (HDL) to detect leaks despite having one available for use. The owner indicated that he utilizes the visual and odor methods of leak detection. The owner was instructed that the HDL must be used, according to manufacturer's instructions, to detect leaks. Manifests were not available for review at time of the inspection. 3) Manifests were not available for review at time of the inspection. This potential item of non-compliance will be referred to the Hazardous Waste section for review.
