COMMENTS: In a compliance inspection conducted on 02/26/2014, AQD staff oberved operations at Marquipt (3100 SW 10th St. Pompano Beach). The facility has one large spray booth where they paint divets (cranes) that are used in the marine industry. Ms. Rhonda Hood usually accompanies staff on the inspection, however she was not available so another coworker (Robert) accompanied staff on the inspection. The facility has a hazardous materials storage area that was properly maintained, however one of the drums was improperly labeled and it was brought to staffs attention. The VOC records were submitted to the department the following day via email and the facility is below it's permit threshold.
