COMMENTS:

I drove into the facility yard and met with Randy Bacon, Maintenance Department. Afterwards I observed the one silo, the one batcher baghouse and the concrete pavement yard. The facility was not in operation. No problems or changes in equipment were noted.

According to Department computer records, the last compliance testing was on 1/27/2006. No test record was observed for 2007. No test record observed for 2008. The entitlement for transfer of ownership was effective 5/15/2008.

I called Vic Keisker, (850) 527-9408 on 7/28/2008 to discuss the 2008 testing. He explained that the silos were full (from the previous owner) when the transfer of ownership took effect. The silos contents have to be taken down in order to have loading space for a proper VE test. The facility is in the process of doing maintenance and emptying the silos before compliance testing can be conducted. Mr. Keisker said the facility intends to complete compliance testing (for 2008).

Mr. Keisker called back. He attempted to contact Frank Kerry, Plant Operator. Mr. Kerry told him a tentative time period of testing will occur in about two weeks. Mr. Kiesker would use the NWDAIR email to send the notification for the 15 day requirement if necessary (testing somewhere around August 11th or 14th).
