This facility has a spray booth, bag house system, lay-up room, sanding room. hazardous material storage and offices. They manufacturer hot-tubs, tubs, and sinks. Mr. Materson discussed with AQD staff that he may be moving to another location in 4-6 months. AQD staff informed him that he would need to obtain another permit at that time as the General Permit is not transferable.
