Dear Ms. Martinache:

The Department inspected the above referenced facility on July 13, 2011. During the inspection following non-compliance issues were noted which require your cooperation and action to bring the facility in compliance.

First issue is regarding the air general permit for the facility. The Department noted that New Horizon Pet Services was recently purchased by Pet Angel World Services. Although New Horizon Pet Service has an active general permit, the permit is not transferable. Pet Angel, as the new owner of the facility, must submit a new application within thirty days of the purchase of the former business. The Department requests that a new application form be submitted to our Tallahassee office within thirty days. We are enclosing a copy of the application form with instruction for your use.

The second issue was the lack of a startup/ shutdown/malfunction plan for New Horizon's crematory. Florida regulations require this plans be on site. You stated that your Pinellas Park location has a plan which could be modified and put in use for the New Horizon's crematory. We would appreciate receiving a copy of this pan within 30 days, you can email a copy of your modified plan to Sherrill.Culliver@dep.state.fl.us.

You also inquired about moving your small crematory from your Pinellas Park location to New Horizon Pet Services. Looking at your Pinellas Park location (AIR ID no. 1030136), the smallest crematory appears to be a Crawford C500P. Our records show the C500P is a 75 lb/hr crematory that has an afterburner temperature of 1400°F with a one second residence time. Furthermore, our records show that this crematory is a pre- August 30, 1989 crematory. Please be advised that if you are planning to move this crematory to a new location, it will be considered a new construction and you may need to upgrade this unit to meet these regulatory requirements:

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
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1. The crematory must have an afterburner temperature of 1800°F with a one second residence time.
2. The crematory must have a pollutant monitoring system to automatically control combustion based on continuous in-stack opacity measurement. Such system shall be calibrated to restrict combustion in the primary chamber whenever any opacity exceeding fifteen percent (15%) opacity is occurring.
3. After updating the crematory, please submit a new application to our Tallahassee office that includes the updated crematory. This application does not have to be the same application that is required for the change of ownership.
4. When updated crematory is permitted, please conduct a compliance test within thirty days after updated crematory is installed.
5. Finally, please retain documentation of the updates on the crematory.

These requirements are contained in Rule 62-296.401(6), please visit our website at <http://www.dep.state.fl.us/air/rules/fac/62-296.pdf> for the details pertaining to this rule.

Please see that the above referenced two non-compliance issues are addressed within thirty days as they constitute a violation of Florida's air regulation. Should you have any questions, please call Sherrill Culliver at (239) 344-5629.
