They installed additional heat recovery heat exchanger are in operation which recover the waste heat from the generator and utilize it to heat the hot water for the Church of Scientology Fort Harrison Ave Hotel, reducing the demand for the natural gas boilers.

Prior to any sale, other change of ownership, or permanent shutdown of the facility, the owner or operator is encouraged to notify the Department of the pending action. The owner shall remain liable for corrective actions that may be required as a result of any violations occurring in the time after the sale or legal transfer of the facility or emissions unit, but before a new owner is entitled to use an air general permit.
