COMMENTS: Ms. Debbie Evernham, Animal Control ACO II, who provided me with requested records and escorted me on the inspection of the crematory, met me upon my arrival at the facility. Ms. Barbara Sviglin of Pensacola P.O.C., Inc. was also on site to perform the annual facility Visible Emissions (VE) test. I observed the VE test and although I am not a certified VE tester, I did not observe any visible emissions during the test.

The answer to question 4c is no, in the past this answer raised questions within the Department as to whether or not the crematory was operated correctly (Warning Letter NWAP 005-1698). Documentation provided by the crematory manufacturer and subsequent correspondence with the Department resulted in the Department closing the investigation with no action being taken and the facility allowed to operate prior to the secondary chamber achieving 1600 degrees Fahrenheit.
