COMMENTS: 1) Facility is operating without Entitlement. Co-owner, Jackson Doyle was given a Perchhloroethylene Dry Cleaner Air General Permit Notification form at time of the inspection. Mr. Doyle stated the facility was purchased by him and Ms. Jackie Brown in January 2008. 2) Several containers of liquids (possibly containing perc) and a container containing separator water are open to the atmosphere. 3) Storage container for sludge open to the atmosphere. 4) Floor surrounding the perc machine and hazardous waste storage area not properly sealed. 4) Facility does not have a log of dates of when dry cleaning system components were inspected for leaks and could not provide documentation of leak detections being conducted. Facility posses a halogen leak detector and the owner indicated it is used to perform leak detection checks approximately every 3 months. 5) This inspection was conducted in conjuction with the FDEP Central Distict's Hazardous Waste Section. All hazardous waste finding are documented in a separate report prepared by the hazardous waste inspector.
