Description of Reasonable Precautions			
Below, or as an attachment to this form, provide details of all types of reasonable precautions to be used to prevent unconfined emissions at the facility. The intent of the Proposed Recycling Center Facility located within the City of Pembroke Pines is to receive and re-distribute concrete and construction waste debris, that would normally be retained at landfill sites, back to a useable construction product. The primary purpose is the reprocessing of old materials into new products, with the aims of preventing the waste of potentially useful materials, reducing the consumption of fresh raw materials, reducing energy usage, reducing air and water pollution by reducing the need for "conventional" waste disposal, and lowering green house gas emissions The recyclable materials will originate from the construction and Landscape industry. They include concrete and vegetative debris. These materials are either brought to a collection center or picked-up from the curbside; and sorted, cleaned and reprocessed into new products bound for manufacturing. The recycled materialsare generally used for items such as landscape mulch, pipe bedding and roadway base material. To judge the environmental benefits of recycling, the cost of this entire process must be compared to the cost of virgin extraction. In order for recycling to be economically viable, there usually must be a steady supply of recyclates and constant demand for the reprocessed goods; Therefore we ask for certain variances to be sustained for a three year period as this will be a pilot program for that timeframe. After the three year period, the feasibility of the project will be evaluated and the granted variances will be brought up to code and City standards.			

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Description of Facility

Concrete will be crushed on site and immediately redistributed to the construction industry air quality procedures will include water truck use for dust control. The site has a 17' berm around the perimeter for noise control. No hazourdous wastes are permitted and concrete will inspected and verified prior to admittance. A truck wash will be incorporated onsite for further control of debris from the site.
