To whom it may concern:

Continental Florida Materials, Inc. (CFM) is submitting this concrete batching plant air general permit registration for re-registration of the Stuart Ready Mix facility to the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) Division of Air Resource Management in Tallahassee. The Stuart Ready Mix facility currently operates under Air General Permit No. 0850010-004-AG. The facility is located at 1715 South Federal Highway, Stuart, Martin County, 34997.

CFM has enclosed the Concrete Batching Plant Air General Permit Registration Form [new DEP Form No. 62-210.920(2)(b), effective January 10, 2007] for the re-registration of the existing facility. Also enclosed is the required \$100 air general permit registration processing fee per Rule 62-4.050(4)(p)(2), F.A.C.

In accordance with Rule 62-296.414(4)(a), F.A.C., visible emissions (VE) testing for controlled exhaust points is required to be completed 30 days after commencing operation, and annually thereafter. CFM Stuart is temporarily shutdown and will complete visible emissions testing for the facility within 30 days after the operation commences. In addition, CFM will submit a VE testing notification to the Southeast District of FDEP, at least 15 days prior to the established testing date(s).
