Dick:

I talked to the facility (Carmen Bugay) this morning about permitting for this facility. She said they registered for a general permit last week. EPD visited them about two weeks ago and was about to send them a letter requiring them to submit a construction permit for the facility. They wanted to register for a general permit for their flexographic presses, but they have other emission units. The other units include a silo with dust collector and a cyclone for waste cardboard collection and separation. They also have a boiler that will be regulated if fired by diesel fuel. This facility is similar to one they have in Tampa (0570260) that has had air permits for 15-20 years, but may be shut down and the work transferred to Orlando.

Please reject any general permit registration from this facility as being ineligible for a general permit because they have more than one emission unit. I will copy you on the letter that we hope to mail by tomorrow.
