
We have closure on the two AGP issue at the same Cruz location.

I talked with O/AR, Mrs. Rhonda Cruz and explained to her that for her situation the State AGP rules were specific in not allowing two AGP's at the same location. She explained that she was concerned about exceeding her threshold limits of her existing AGP (Glassworks of Largo-AIRS ID# 1030515-002-AG) and was trying to avoid any problems by going for a second AGP. I mentioned that she might want to consider an Air Operating (AO) permit. There was some concern on her part about the cost, and she alluded to the fact that it may have been a consultant that told her that the cost of a permit might be in the upwards of \$10,000. I explained to her that I was not completely familiar with the major permit pricing structure, but it sounded a little bit out of line for her size facility, so I provided her with the name of Cindy Zhang-Torres and a contact number that she could call for further details regarding the larger permit possibilities. She seemed very interested about talking with Cindy and seemed to be very grateful for the assistance.

To make a long story short, Mrs. Cruz sent me an e-mail (see attachment) yesterday requesting that the subject item registration be withdrawn, so as you can see in the screen prints below I have already withdrawn the registration and stopped the thirty (30) day review clock. Her initial e-mail in the attachment was worded a little bit strange, so I had to go back to her to clarify her request, for the record.

Immediately below is the complete content of the text which I have included in the comment section of the Facility Screen capture below for this facility and then below that a screen capture of the permit events screen showing WITHDRAWN.
