Ok, well Mrs. Cruz stated she is renting the other side of the building out to other company, because they couldn't start their own business and she needed the rent money to pay the overhead for the building. She is the owner representative of the other company Cruz Performance Fiberglass, and she did not want their resin usage tracked on her original permit. 0515, because would cause her to go above the limit.

The building does not have separate units. It is the same building, just the other side of the same building and same address is being shared with the so called other company.

The original GP 0515 is under her husbands name Kenneth Cruz at the same address and is designated to be for the construction of tanks and pool sumps. No more cars, boats or lamp post. The other people Rhonda Cruz says are paying her rent, which she would not give the names of the people in the other company, and they are operating under her GP 0535. and she states she is the owner and representative for Cruz fiberglass on the general permit 0535.

Rhonda Cruz stated she told them they would have to have a separate GP, because their resin usage would make her go over her permit limitation. She stated they were going to keep their own record of resin usage. I told her she could get a synthetic minor permit, and she stated she had contacted the consultants on our PC list, and it would cost upward from 10,000. I informed her that I would check but it appears that they could not use 2 GP's per the rule under these circumstances.
