Gary,

Mr. Cruz may not understand our 30-day review process, but if in fact Mrs. Cruz had listed the latest address (on the 0535 registration form) as exactly the same as the 0515 entitlement (**4470 63rd Circle**) we would have informed him of the no two AGP requirement and consequently denied his registration. But, since he indicated the address was **4470-B 63rd Circle**, it made it appear that there may be two separate sites, and that's why we called upon you folks for verification of our concerns, which by the way, we are very much appreciative of your assistance in helping us to clarify this situation.

If these folks wish to withdraw their latest AGP Registration for Cruz Performance Fiberglass LLC, we would need a letter from the listed O/AR Rhonda Cruz, President to that effect. We are already sixteen (16) days into the review period, so we have about two weeks left before we will actually have to issue a denial. Now that we know for sure the situation, I will call them to let them know that they should send us a letter requesting the registration be withdrawn if that is what they wish to do.

I am not sure of your direction regarding the small business and other permitting options, but our Small Business Environmental Assistance Program operates outside of the regulatory arena and has no authority for "other permitting options". On the other hand if you are talking about the Federal Small Business Administration (SBA), there may be opportunity for some financial assistance if they had to go the major permit route.

He is not sure that he would go over his current permit, since he is not boat, or doing the old car part contract, but he has picked up a new client making pool sumps 2 months ago, and was concerned it would become a problem on the limit of
