The Department has received the Title V General Permit Notification Form for the dry cleaning facility that you submitted on October 28, 1998.





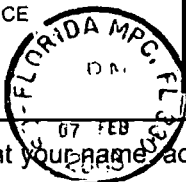
