The Permitting and Compliance Authority (PCA) [City of Jacksonville, Environmental & Compliance Department, Environmental Quality Division] hereby amends permit 0310323-003-AO as follows:

Section I. Facility Information / Subsection A. Facility/Project Description:

From: This permit is for the operation of a Flexographic Printing Operation. The natural gas fired, coater dryer Chadwick P1080 Linerflex Printing Press shall be operated for printing on Kraft and coated paper used in manufacturing corrugated paperboard products.

To: This permit is for the operation of a Flexographic Printing Operation. The electrically heated, coater dryer Chadwick P1080 Linerflex Printing Press shall be operated for printing on Kraft and coated paper used in manufacturing corrugated paperboard products.

The PCA amends the referenced permit as authorized by Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.), Rule 62-4.080, and Section 403.061(14), Florida Statutes (F.S.). This Notice of Permit Amendment does not modify any other conditions in the referenced permit. All permit conditions are in effect and fully enforceable. Please attach this Notice of Permit Amendment to your copy of the permit.

A person whose substantial interests are affected by the proposed permitting decision may petition for an administrative proceeding (hearing) under Sections 120.569, and 120.57, F.S. The petition must contain the information set forth below and must be filed (received) in the Office of General Counsel, City of Jacksonville, 117 West Duval Street, Suite 480, Jacksonville, FL 32202. Petitions filed by the permit applicant or any of the parties listed below must be filed within fourteen days of receipt of this notice. Petitions filed by any persons other than those entitled to written notice under Section 120.60(3) F.S., must be filed within fourteen days of receipt of this notice. Under Section 120.60(3), F.S., however, any person who asked the PCA for notice of agency action may file a petition within fourteen days of receipt of that notice. A petitioner shall mail a copy of the petition to the applicant at the address indicated above at the time of filing. The failure of any person to file a petition within the appropriate time period shall constitute a waiver of that person's right to request an administrative determination (hearing) under Section 120.569, and 120.57, F.S., or to intervene in this proceeding and participate as a party to it. Any subsequent intervention will be only at the approval of the presiding officer upon the filing of a motion in compliance with Rule 28-106.205 of the Florida Administrative Code.

A petition that disputes the material facts, on which the PCA's action is based, must contain the following information:

- a. The name and address of each agency affected and each agency's file or identification number, if known;
- b. The name, address, and telephone number of the petitioner, the name, address, and telephone number of the petitioner's representative, if any, which shall be the address for service purposes during the course of the proceeding; and an explanation of how the petitioner's substantial interests will be affected by the agency determination;
- c. A statement of how and when petitioner received notice of the agency action or proposed action;
- d. A statement of all disputed issues of material facts. If there are none, the petition must so indicate;
- e. A concise statement of the ultimate facts alleged, as well as the rules and statutes which entitle the petitioner to relief.
- f. A statement of the specific rules or statutes the petitioner contends require reversal or modification of the agency's proposed action, and;
- g. A statement of the relief sought by the petitioner, stating precisely the action petitioner wishes the agency to take with respect to the agency's proposed action.

A petition that does not dispute the material facts upon which the PCA's action is based shall state that no such facts are in dispute and otherwise shall contain the same information as set forth above, as required by Rule 28-106.301, F.A.C..

Because the administrative hearing process is designed to formulate final agency action, the filing of a petition means that the PCA's final action may be different from the position taken by it in this notice. Persons whose substantial interests will be affected by any such final decision of the PCA on the application have the right to petition to become a party to the proceeding, in accordance with the requirements set forth above.


Mediation is not available in this proceeding.

This permit is final and effective on the date filed with the Clerk of the PCA unless a petition is filed in accordance with the above paragraphs or unless a request for extension of time in which to file a petition is filed within the time specified for filing a petition. Upon timely filing of a petition or a request for an extension of time, this permit will not be effective until further Order of the PCA.

When the Order (Permit) is final, any party to the Order has the right to seek judicial review of the Order pursuant to Section 120.68, F.S., by the filing of a Notice of Appeal pursuant to Rule 9.110, Florida Rules of Appellate procedure, with the Clerk of the Department in the Office of General Counsel, City of Jacksonville, 117 West Duval Street, Suite 480, Jacksonville, FL 32202, and with the Clerk of the Department of Environmental Protection in the Office of General Counsel, Mail Station 35, 3900 Commonwealth Boulevard, Tallahassee, FL 32399-3000, and by filing a copy of the Notice of Appeal accompanied by the applicable filing fees with the appropriate District Court of Appeal. The Notice of Appeal must be filed within 30 days from the date the Final Order is filed with the Clerk of the PCA.
