Facility Location: The applicant operates the existing Lansing Smith Electric Generating Plant, which is located in Bay County at 4300 County Road 2300, Southport, Florida 32409.

Project: The existing facility is an electric power plant consisting of the following emis-sions units: two coalfired steam generators, Pratt Whitney Twin-Pac compustion turbine peaking unit, and a combined-cycle unit consisting of two combustion turbineelectrical generator with duct-fired recovery heat steam generators and a comsteam turbineelectrical generator. On June 19, 2012, the applicant applied for a Ti-tle V air operation permit revision to incorporate applicable quirements from nonstruction Permit No. 0050014-019-AC for the OpFlex Peaking project and to update the lists of active internal com-bustion engines. Petitions: A person whose substantial interests are affected by the proposed permitting decision may petition for an administrative hearing in accordance with Sections 120.569 and 120.57, F.S. nation of how the belieged facts relate to the specific rules or statutes; and, (g) A statement of the relief sought by the petitioner, stating precisely the action the petitioner wishes the agency to take with respect to the agency's proposed action. A petition that does not dispute the material facts upon which the Permitting Authority's action is based shall state that no such facts are in dispute and otherwise shall contain the same information as set forth above, as required by Rule 28-106.301, FA.C.

Because the administrative hearing process is designed to formulate final agency action, the filing of a petition means that the Permitting Authority's final action may be different from the position taken by it in this Public Notice of Intent to Issue Air Permit. Persons whose substantial interests will be affected by any such final decision of the Permitting Authority on the application have the right to petition to become a party to the proceeding, in accordance with the requirements set forth above.

Mediation: Mediation is not available for this proceeding.

EPA Review: EPA has agreed to treat the draft/proposed Title V air operation permit as a proposed Title V air operation permit as a proposed Title V air operation permit and to perform its 45-day review provided by the law and regulations concurrently with the public comment period, provided that the applicant also transmits an electronic copy of the required proof of publication directly to EPA at the following email address: oquendo.ana@epa.govAlt hough EPA's 45-day review period will be performed concurrently with the public comment period, the dead-line for submitting a citizen petition to object to the EPA Administrator will be determined as if EPA's 45-day review period is performed after the public comment period has ended. The final Title V air operation permit will be issued after the conclusion of the 45-day EPA review period so long as no adverse comments are received that result in a different decision or significant change of terms or conditions. Objections: Finally, pursuant to 42 United States Code (U.S.C.) Any petition shall be based only on objections to the permit that were raised with reasonable specificity during the 30-day public comment period provided in the Public Notice, unless the petitioner demonstrates to the Administrator of the EPA that it was impracticable to raise such objections within the comment period or unless the grounds for such objection arose after the comment period of the EPA does not stay the effective date of any permit properly issued pursuant to the provisions of Chapter &2-213, F.A.C. Petitions filed with the Administrator of EPA must meet the requirements of 42 U.S.C.
