Tarmac America, LLC, Pennsuco Cement Plant Miami-Dade County, Florida

The Department of Environmental Protection announces receipt of an application for an air construction permit from Tarmac America, LLC. The application requests authorization to fire alternative fuels at the existing Pennsuco Cement Plant, which is located in Miami-Dade County at 11000 Northwest 121 Way in Medley, Florida. As requested, temporary trial burns would not be conducted and the plant would be authorized to fire alternative fuels once construction is complete on the material handling systems. The applicant must meet all of its current emission limits and comply with all existing continuous emissions monitoring requirements when alternative fuels are used. The cement kiln is currently authorized to fire bituminous coal, oil, natural gas and whole tires. The applicant proposes to install and operate mechanical and pneumatic handling systems to fire the following non-hazardous alternative fuel materials, in any combination, in the existing cement kiln: agricultural film (non-chlorinated plastic); tire-derived fuel (with or without steel belts); tire fluff (tire crumbs without steel belts); manufacturer reject roofing shingles; clean cellulosic biomass (e.g., green wood, forest thinnings, sawdust, trees trimmings, clean woody land clearing debris and clean construction and demolition (C&D) wood); other cellulosic biomass (e.g. copper-chromium-arsenic-treated wood, creosote-treated wood, C&D debris not meeting the definition of clean C&D wood, plywood, particle board, medium density fiberboard, oriented strand board, laminated beams, finger-jointed trim and sheet goods); agricultural fibrous organic byproducts and residues (e.g., peanut hulls, rice hulls, corn husks, citrus peels, cotton gin byproducts, animal bedding, etc.); pre-consumer reject paper; carpet-derived fuel; and engineered fuel (a selected combination of non-hazardous materials such as those identified above and other alternative fuel materials). These materials have a useful heating value and will be cofired with coal to offset a portion of the coal needed to produce heat for the existing cement kiln. The applicant proposes to use alternative fuels for cement production in part to reduce its reliance on fossil fuels, such as coal. The applicant also requests revising the term bituminous coal to coal. The project includes electric- or dieselpowered shredding and screening equipment to further process these materials as necessary.

Actual emissions from the existing cement kiln are continuously monitored for the following pollutants: carbon monoxide (CO), nitrogen oxides (NO<sub>X</sub>), sulfur dioxide (SO<sub>2</sub>) and total hydrocarbons (THC). There is also a continuous monitor for measuring the stack opacity. The applicant will continue to use all required continuous emissions monitoring systems to ensure compliance with existing and enforceable permit limitations during the firing of alternative fuels. Mercury emissions will be estimated based on material balance and particulate matter emissions will be determined by stack test as necessary. The applicant does not request the relaxation of any existing permit limit and will become subject to more stringent standards applicable to portland cement plants under Title 40, Part 63 and Subpart LLL of the Code of Federal Regulations that become effective in 2013.

The initial application was received on April 20, 2011. The application is under review by the Department and is available for public inspection during normal business hours from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, except legal holidays, at the following physical office locations:
