I have a follow up question on this comment. I restated the comment below.

40. Acid Rain Permit – On page 68, Condition A.2 should be revised to simply state that the sulfur dioxide allowances are allocated for the units by EPA and that information is available on the EPA website. The allowance allocations provided in this condition in the proposed permit are incorrect.

The allowances entered in the table are from the code of federal regulations (CFR) version dated July 1, 2007, accessed on 09/18/2008 via the CFR on the web site http://www.access.gpo.gov. The same allowances are posted on the e-CFR web site at http://ecfr.gpoaccess.gov.
