

Dear Mr. McArthur:

We have reviewed the request in the Sholtes and Koogler letter dated December 2, 1983, to allow boilers C and D at the Suwannee River Chemical Complex to operate continuously (8,760 hours per year). Specific Condition B5 of your PSD permit was intended to limit the operational hours of these boilers to protect the Class I increment in the Okefenokee National Wildlife Area. However, the above letter states that a limitation of hours of operation for these boilers has no bearing on the ambient impacts on the Okefenokee Class I area, nor does the preliminary determination state that any such limitation is necessary. We, therefore, void Specific Condition B5 of your Prevention of Significant Deterioration permit (PSD-FL-083) for the Suwannee River Chemical Complex.
