This letter is a follow up to the conversation that occurred on March 5, 2004 addressing the J.H Phillips Station Title V Air Operation Permit Renewal. A discrepancy was found by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) during the review process of the permit renewal application submitted by Tampa Electric Company (TEC) on December 23, 2003. The discrepancy was that two conditions, which were part of the Federal Permit No. PSD-FL-071 issued on April 2, 1981, were not incorporated into any of the subsequent permits for J.H. Phillips Station. According to the Federal Permit No. PSD-FL-071, the two conditions omitted from all the operating permits in TEC's files, which were transferred from Sebring Utilities Commission, are the following:

**Condition 5**. Operation of each engine shall be limited to 8,400 hours per year.

**Condition 6.** Maximum fuel oil consumption shall be 9,199.5 pounds per hour for each engine.

Sebring Utilities Commission once owned and operated J.H. Phillips Station. The ownership and operations was then transferred to TEC in 1991. TEC does not have any records explaining the reasons for the omittance or removal of these two conditions from any subsequent permits. The facility has been operating in compliance with all the conditions of the Title V Air Operation permit issued on June 24, 1999. The following is a table with the past five years information supporting compliance with the Title V Air Operation permit:
