Relevant standard: NESHAP for Boat Manufacturing, effective date: August 22, 2001.
The facility is an existing major source, so the compliance date is August 22, 2004.

Chris-Craft Corporation make fiberglass boats using open molding operations. With open molding, most of our emissions are styrene and methyl methacrylate from production and tooling resins and gel coats. We do have closed molding operations also. The majority (or all?) of our emissions are fugitive emissions: therefore, we do not have identification of "points" of emissions. We expect to build 400 boats per year. We do not build any boats in aluminum.
