
Per our telephone conversation of December 22, 2011, this letter informs the Department that Indiantown Cogeneration, L.P. intends to conduct a test of a different quality coal.

The Indiantown Generating Plant fires bituminous coal to generate electricity. The coal used during the test will still be bituminous coal, and will still have a sulfur content under 2%. The coal will have a higher ash content (up to 20%) and lower heat content (down to 22 million Btu per ton) than coal historically used. There is no air permit or siting board approval condition that limits the coal composition, and Indiantown Cogeneration, L.P. will comply with all permit conditions while firing the new coal.

Indiantown Cogeneration, L.P. will use existing equipment to keep coal types separated. We expect to take delivery of the first shipment of the new coal on or about April 27, 2012. First firing of the new fuel will depend on how the facility is dispatched; assuming dispatch at reduced load operation the test firing will occur on or about May 15, 2012. Indiantown Cogeneration, L.P. will retain and review operating parameter data from our existing facility system (e.g. temperatures and oxygen concentrations through the system), and will retain and review emissions data from our existing facility continuous emissions monitoring and continuous opacity monitoring systems. If operation and emission parameters are as-expected, Indiantown Cogeneration L.P. will begin to blend in the lower-cost coal as appropriate during some operations.

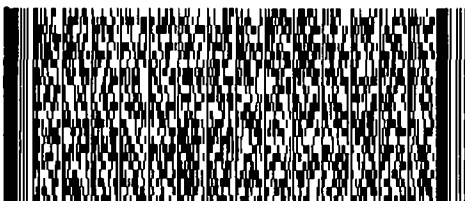

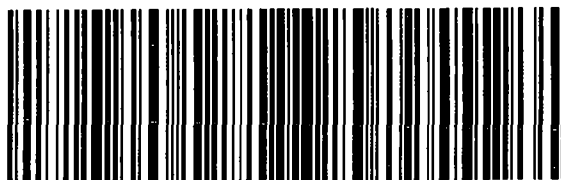
