The facility consists of six key regulated emission units with a total generating capacity of 128.7MW. There are two regulated diesel generators, four simple cycle combustion tur-bines, and miscellaneous unregu-lated units. As a result of this revision, which arises from the Air Construction Permit 0870003-07-AC, a 48MW simple cycle combustion tur-bine (E.U.ID No. 011), a nominal 1,000,000 gallon No. 2 fuel oil storage tank (unregulated), and a water tank (unregulated) have been added to the facility. To reduce pollution, a combination of control techniques is used at the plant including water injection, ignition timing retardation and use of low sulfur fuel oil. Further, when the operational hours of the new simple cycle combustion turbine exceeds 2500 hours a selective catalytic reduction (SCR) unit must be installed to help control its NOx emissions. Also included in this permit are insignificant emis-sions units and activities.

Permitting Authority: Applications for Title V air Operation Permits are subject to review in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 403. Florida Statutes (F.S.) and Chapters 62-4, 62-210, 62-213, and 62-214 of the Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.). The proposed project is not exempt from air permitting requirements and an air permit is re-quired to operate the facility. Petitions filed by any persons other than those entitled to written notice under section 120.60(3) F.S. must be filed within 14 days of publication of this Public Notice or receipt of the written notice, whichever occurs first. Under section 120.60(3) of the F. S., however, any person who has asked the Permitting Authority for notice of agency action may file a petition agency action may file a petition within 14 days of receipt of that notice, regardless of the date of publication. A petitioner shall mail a copy of the petition to the applicant at the address indicated above, at the time of filing. The failure of any person to file a petition within the appropriate time period shall constitute a waiver that person's right to request an administrative determination (hear ing) under sections 120.569 and 120.57 of the F.S. or to intervene in this proceeding and participate as a party to it.
