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

Dear Mr. McCash:

The Department reviewed the attached request by GeoSyntec Consultants on behalf of your facility for an extension of the expiration date of the referenced air construction permit for the construction and installation of a GCES and two flares at the Oak Hammock Disposal (OHD) facility. The letter indicates that in 2004 and 2005, the amount of waste disposed (943,300 TPY) and the non methane organic compounds (NMOC) emissions rate (19.6 TPY) for both years are still below the required threshold value of 2,750,000 TPY waste and 50 TPY NMOC emissions.

The expiration date is hereby extended from April 30, 2006 to **April 30, 2010** to allow sufficient time for the construction and installation of the GCES and the flares.

For a construction permit, an extension shall be granted if the applicant can demonstrate that, upon completion, the extended permit will comply with the standards and conditions required by the applicable regulations. [Rule 62-4.080(3), F.A.C.]

A copy of this letter shall be filed with the referenced permit and shall become part of the permit. This permitting decision is issued pursuant to Chapter 403, Florida Statutes.

A person whose substantial interests are affected by the proposed permitting decision may petition for an administrative proceeding (hearing) under sections 120.569 and 120.57 of the Florida Statutes. The petition must contain the information set forth below and must be filed (received) in the Office of General Counsel of the Department at 3900 Commonwealth Boulevard, Mail Station #35, Tallahassee, Florida, 32399-3000. Petitions filed by the permit applicant or any of the parties listed below must be filed within fourteen days of receipt of this notice of intent. Petitions filed by any persons other than those entitled to written notice under section 120.60(3) of the Florida Statutes must be filed within fourteen days of publication of the public notice or within fourteen days of receipt of this notice of intent, whichever occurs first. Under section 120.60(3), however, any person who asked the Department for notice of agency action may file a petition within fourteen days of receipt of that notice, regardless of the date of publication. A petitioner shall mail a copy of the petition to the applicant at the address indicated above at the time of filing. The failure of any person to file a petition within the appropriate time period shall

Persons subject to regulation pursuant to any federally delegated or approved air program should be aware that Florida is specifically not authorized to issue variances or waivers from any requirements of any such federally delegated or approved program. The requirements of the program remain fully enforceable by the Administrator of the EPA and by any person under the Clean Air Act unless and until the Administrator separately approves any variance or waiver in accordance with the procedures of the federal program.

This permitting decision is final and effective on the date filed with the clerk of the Department unless a petition is filed in accordance with the above paragraphs or unless a request for extension of time in which to file a petition is filed within the time specified for filing a petition pursuant to Rule 62-110.106, F.A.C., and the petition conforms to the content requirements of Rules 28-106.201 and 28-106.301, F.A.C. Upon timely filing of a petition or a request for extension of time, this order will not be effective until further order of the Department.

Any party to this permitting decision (order) has the right to seek judicial review of it under section 120.68 of the Florida Statutes, by filing a notice of appeal under Rule 9.110 of the Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure with the clerk of the Department of Environmental Protection in the Office of General Counsel, Mail Station #35, 3900 Commonwealth Boulevard, Tallahassee, Florida, 32399-3000, and by filing a copy of the notice of appeal accompanied by the applicable filing fees with the appropriate District Court of Appeal. The notice must be filed within thirty days after this order is filed with the clerk of the Department.



On behalf of Omni Waste of Osceola County, LLC (Omni), GeoSyntec Consultants (GeoSyntec) has prepared this letter to request for an extension of the air construction permit for the Oak Hammock Disposal Facility (OHDF). The OHDF is a Class I municipal solid waste landfill near Holopaw, Osceola County, Florida, and is owned and operated by Omni.

The air construction permit was issued by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) on 11 April 2003 for the construction of a gas collection and extraction system (GCES) and two flares as part of the Phase I development of the Class I landfill. This permit expires on 30 April 2006, and Specific Condition No. 6 of Section II of the permit states that "...the permittee, for good cause, may request that this construction permit be extended..." This letter provides the reasons for requesting an extension of the permit.

Specific Condition No. 4 of Section III of the permit states that "... the GECS and at least one but no more than two flares be installed and operational by the time 2,750,000 tons of waste have been disposed in the landfill or annual emissions of non-methane hydrocarbons (NMOC) are greater than or equal to 50 tons per year..." The OHDF began accepting waste on 26 January 2004 and the annual amount of waste disposed in 2004 and 2005 are summarized in Table 1. As noted in Table 1, the total amount of waste that has been disposed in the landfill is 942,300 tons, which is significantly less than the 2,750,000 tons limit in the permit.


Table 1 also presents a summary of calculated NMOC emission rates for 2004 and 2005. The 2005 NMOC emission rate calculation was submitted to FDEP using the electronic annual operating report (EAOR) software, version 5.00. The confirmation/file number 0970079\_0222206.sub was issued as a receipt upon submittal. As noted in Table 1, the calculated NMOC emission rates are well below the threshold value of 50 tons/year. GeoSyntec therefore requests for an extension of the air construction permit for the OHDF.

Hi Ms. Heron,

Based on our conversation this morning regarding extension of the Air Construction Permit for the Oak Hammock Disposal Facility in Osceola County, FL, I request you to extend the permit by 4 years. As I discussed with you, OHDF is a new landfill which started operations in Jan 2004. We have constructed 3 cells at the site to-date. Two cells have waste and the third started accepting waste recently. The fourth cell is currently under construction.

The life of the currently permitted four cells is about 5 years, i.e., the first four cells at the landfill are expected to reach final grades by early 2009. The gas collection system in these cells will be installed as part of closure of these cells. If a construction time of 1 to 1.5 years is assumed for installing gas collection system in all 4 cells, it will be around mid-2010 when we get done. As a result, I am requesting an extension for four years from April 2006.


