

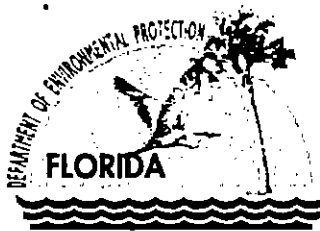

Dear Mr. Kennedy:

On April 19, 2004, the Department received a request to modify Recovery Boiler No. 4's sulfur dioxide (SO<sub>2</sub>) emission limits. Based on our review of the proposed project, we have determined that the following additional information is needed in order to continue processing this application package. Please provide all assumptions, calculations, and reference material(s), that are used or reflected in any of your responses to the following issues:

1. In air construction permit, No. AC54-192550/PSD-FL-171, the SO<sub>2</sub> emission limiting standards of 109.9 lbs/hour and 481.4 TPY were established. The 109.9 lbs/hour represents the 3-hour, the 24-hour and the annual standard, as discussed in the Final Determination for this permit and used for preconstruction review purposes. This value of 109.9 lbs/hour was also used by Mr. David Buff, P.E. of Record, when modeling for the 3-hour, the 24-hour, and the annual AAQS, and when evaluating PSD increment issues for this permit. The basis for this limit, a concentration of 37.5 ppmvd @ 8% oxygen, was removed at the request of Mr. Vernon Adams for this emissions unit (see letter dated May 23, 1991; as discussions went, it was decided that we needed to only limit the independent variable, which is the 109.9 lbs/hour). These allowable SO<sub>2</sub> emission limitations have not been altered by any subsequent SIP air construction permitting actions to date. In order to continue processing this request, then the past SO<sub>2</sub> actual emissions must be compared to the future allowable/potential emissions, which was also pointed out in the Final Determination for permit No. AC54-192550/PSD-FL-171; and, based on the increase in the 3-hour and the 24-hour standards that were requested, the SO<sub>2</sub> increases (allowable to future allowable) are 1443.2 TPY and 481.4 TPY, respectively, where the PSD significant increase value of 40 TPY is established in Table 212.400-2, Chapter 62-212, F.A.C. Therefore, please submit the appropriate application pages and preconstruction review analyses pursuant to Rule 62-212.400(5), F.A.C., which should include the SO<sub>2</sub> emissions evaluation from past actuals to future allowables/potential. In addition, please submit the AAQS, PSD increment and additional impact analyses as required per Rule 62-212.400, F.A.C.

2. Referring back to issue No. 1, above, this evaluation should also revert back to and include all of the pollutant emission increases afforded by the Pollution Control Project (PCP) permitting actions, Nos. 1070005-007-AC & 1070005-017-AC, processed by the Northeast District office as if never constructed. This means that all increases of SO<sub>2</sub> emissions and other affected pollutants from this project and the PCP project must be included as one project for preconstruction review evaluation pursuant to Rule 62-212.400(5), F.A.C. Therefore, please submit the appropriate preconstruction review analyses pursuant to Rule 62-212.400(5), F.A.C., and include all increases of SO<sub>2</sub> emissions and other affected pollutants from this project and the PCP project as one project and reflect the comparison of past actual emissions to future allowable/potential emissions. In addition, please submit the AAQS, PSD increment and additional impact analyses as required per Rule 62-212.400, F.A.C.

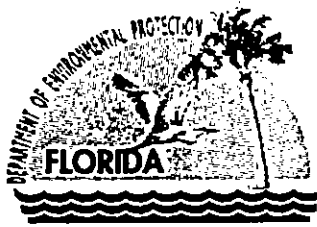


