



PUBLIC NOTICE

Florida Department of Environmental Protection Division of Air Resource Management, Bureau of Air Regulation Draft Air Construction Permit Project No. 1070005-062-AC Georgia-Pacific Consumer Operations LLC – Palatka Milli Putnam County, Florida

Applicant: The applicant for this project is the Georgia-Pacific Consumer Operations LLC. The applicant's authorized representative and mailing address is: Mr. Gary Frost, Vice-President Operations, P.O. Box 919, Palatka, Florida 32178-0919.

Facility Location: Georgia-Pacific Consumer Operations LLC operates an existing pulp and paper mill (Palatka Mill), which is located in Putnam County, North of CR 216 and West of US 17 in Palatka, Florida.

Project: Currently, the No. 4 Combination Boller is authorized to fire bark/wood as the primary fuel and No. 6 fuel oil as a startup and supplemental fuel. The applicant requests authorization to fire of up to 6% by weight knots and rejects in the No. 4 Combination Boller with bark/wood and other authorized fuels. Knots are pieces of uncooked, wood that are removed from the brown stock pulpprior to the brown stock washing process. Rejects are shives or splinters that are removed by a screening operation after the brown stock washing process. Both knots and rejects (collectively called "fiber rejects") contain wood liber that has not been completely digested and a small amount of residual black liquor, from the digestion process.

Because the properties of fiber rejects are so similar to bark and wood, no emissions increases are expected except for sulfur dloxide. (SO2). This is because of the residual black liquor on the fiber rejects, which contains additional sulfur. Based on an annual limit of 8000 tons of fiber rejects per year, potential SO2 emissions are estimated to increase by 86.4 tons per year. However, other contemporaneous projects at the Palatka Milli will decrease overall SO2 emissions such that the project is not subject to preconstruction review, in accordance with Rule, 62-212,400 of the Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.) for the Prevention of Significant Deterioration of Air Quality.

Permitting Authority: Applications for air construction, permits are subject to review in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 403, Fiorida Statutes (E.S.), and Chapters 62-4, 62-210 and 62-212, F.A.C. The proposed project is not exempt from air permitting requirements and an air permit is required to perform the proposed work. Notice of Intent to Issue AirPermit: The Permitting Authority gives notice of its
intent to issue an air permit
to the applicant for the
project described above.
The applicant has provided
reasonable assurance that
operation, of proposed
equipment will not adversely impact air quality
and that the project will
comply with all appropriate
provisions of Chapters 624, 62-204, 62-210, 62-212,
62-295 and 62-297, F.A.C.
The Permitting Authority
will issue a Final Permit in
accordance with the conditions of the proposed Draft
Permit unless a timely petition for an administrative
hearing is filled under Sections 120.559 and 120.57,
F.S., or unless public comment received in accordance with this notice results in a different decision
or a significant change of
terms or conditions.

Comments: The Permitting Authority will accept written comments concerning the proposed Draft Permit for a period of 14 days from the date of publication of the Public Notice. Written comments must be received by the Permitting Authority by close of business (5:00 p.m.) on or before the end of this 14-day period. If written comments received result in a significant change to the Draft Permit, the Permitting Authority, shall, revise the Draft Permit and require, if applicable, another Public Notice. All comments filed will, be made available for public inspection.

Petitions: A person whose substantial interests are affected by the proposed

permitting decision may petition for an administrative hearing in accordance with Sections 120.569 and 120.57, F.S. The petition must contain the information set forth below and must be filled with (received by) the Department's Agen'cy Clerk In-the 'Office of General Counsel of the Department of Environmental Protection at 3800 Commonwealth Boulevard, Mall Station #35, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-3000. Petitions filled by any persons other than those entitled to written notice under Section 120.60(3), F.S., must be filled within 14 days of publication of this Public Notice or receipt of a written notice, whichever occurs first. Under Section 120.60(3), F.S., however, any, person who asked the Permitting Authority for notice, regardless of the date of publication. A petitioner shall mail a copy of the petition to the applicant at the address indicated above, at the time of filling. The fallure of any person to tille a petition within the appropriate time period shall constitute a waiver of that person's right to request an administrative determination (hearing) under Sections 120.569 and 120.57, F.S., or to intervene in this proceeding and participate as a party to it. Any subsequent intervention (in /a proceeding inflitted by another party) will be only at the approval of the presiding officer upon the filling of a motion in compliance with Rule 28-106.205, F.A.C.

A petition that disputes the material facts on which the Permitting Authority's action is based must contain the following information:

(a) The name and address of each agency affected and each agency sille or identification number, if known; (b) The name, address and telephone number of the petitioner's representative, if any, which shall be the address for service purposes any, which shall be the address for service purposes during the course of the proceeding; and an explanation of how the petitioner's substantial rights will be affected by the agency determination; (c) A statement of when and how the petitioner received notice of the agency action or of the agency action or proposed decision; (d) A statement of all disputed issues of material fact. If there are none, the petition must so state; (e) A con-cise statement of the ultimate facts alleged, includ-ing the specific facts the ing the specific facts the pelitioner contends war-rant reversal or modifica-tion of the agency's pro-posed action; (f) A state-ment of the specific rules or statutes the petitioner contends require reversal or modification of the agenor modification of the agen-cy's proposed action in-cluding an explanation of how the alleged facts relate to the specific rules or stat-utes; and, (g) A statement-of the relief sought by the petitioner, stating precisely the action the petitioner wishes the agency to take with respect to the agen-cy's proposed action. A pe-tition that does not dispute the material facts upon which the Permitting Au-thority's action is based thority's action is, based shall state that no such facts are in dispute and otherwise shall contain the same information as set forth above, as required by Rule 28-106.301, F.A.C.

Because the administrative hearing process is designed to formulate final agency action, the filling of a petition means that the Permitting Authority's final action, may be different from the position taken by it in this Public Notice of Intent to Issue: Air Permit. Persons whose substantial interests will be affected by any such final decision of the Permitting Authority on the application have the right to petition to become a party to the proceeding, in accordance with the requirements set forth above.

Mediation: Mediation is not available for this proceeding.
