Applicant: The applicant for this project is Seminole Electric Cooperative, Inc., Seminole Power Plant, 890 U.S. Highway 17, Palatka, Florida 32177. The applicant's responsible official is: Mr. Michael P. Opalinski, Vice President of Technical Services, Seminole Electric Cooperative, Inc., Post Office Box 272000, Tampa, Florida 33688.

Facility Location: The applicant operates the Seminole Power Plant, which is an electrical utility plant and located East of U.S. Highway 17, approximately seven miles north of Palatka, Putnam County.

Project: The applicant operates the existing power plant in accordance with Title V Air Operation Permit No. 1070025-002-AV, which was issued on January 1, 2005. The applicant requests a revision of the Title V permit to remove the requirement to maintain and operate an ambient monitoring station for SO₂ and PM. The ambient monitoring station was a requirement of Site Certification No. PA-78-10, which was removed from the Site Certification on 07/05/05. This revision process is also being used to replace the existing Appendix TV-4, Title V Conditions (version dated 02/12/02) with Appendix TV-5, Title V Conditions (version dated 03/28/05). These changes, as outlined in the Draft Title V Permit Revision, are the only portions of the Title V permit that are open for review and subject to Public Comment.

Permitting Authority: Applications for Permits are subject to review in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 403, Florida Statutes (F.S.), and Chapters 62-4, 62-210, 62-213 and 62-214, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.). The proposed project is not exempt from air permitting requirements and a Permit is required to operate the facility. The Department's Bureau of Air Regulation is the Permitting Authority responsible for making a Permit determination regarding this project. The Permitting Authority's physical address is: 111 South Magnolia Drive, Suite 4, Tallahassee, Florida 32301. Notice of Intent to Issue An
Air Permit: The Permitting
Authority gives notice of its
intent to issue an air permit to
the applicant for the project
described above. The appli-
cant has provided reasonable
assurance that operation of
the facility will not adversely
impact air quality and that the
project will comply with all
appropriate provisions of
Chapters 62-4, 62-204, 62-210,
62-212, 62-213, 62-214, 62-
256, 62-257, 62-281, 62-296,
and 62-297, F.A.C. The Per-
mitting Authority will issue a
PROPOSED Permit and subse-
quent FINAL Permit in ac-
cordance with the conditions
of the DRAFT Permit unless a
response received in accordance
with the following proce-
dures results in a different
decision or a significant
change of terms or condi-
tions.

Comments: The Permitting
Authority will accept written
comments concerning the
DRAFT Permit for a period of
thirty (30) days from the date
of publication of this Public
Notice. Written comments
must be post-marked and all
e-mail or facsimile comments
must be received by the close
of business (5 pm) on or be-
fore the end of this 30-day pe-
riod by the Permitting Author-
ity at the above address,
email or facsimile. As part of
his or her comments, any per-
son may also request that the
Permitting Authority hold a
public meeting on this permit-
ting action. If the Permitting
Authority determines there is
sufficient interest for a public
meeting, it will publish notice
of the time, date, and location
on the Department's official
web site for notices
(<http://thors6.dep.state.fl.us/onw/>)
and in a newspaper of
general circulation in the area
affected by the permitting
action. For additional informa-
tion, contact the Permitting
Authority at the above ad-
dress or phone number. If
written comments or com-
ments received at a public
meeting result in a significant
change to the DRAFT Permit,

the Permitting Authority shall
issue a Revised DRAFT Per-
mit and require, if applicable,
another Public Notice. All
comments filed will be made
available for public inspec-
tion.

Petitions: A person whose
substantial interests are af-
fected by the proposed per-
mitting decision may petition
for an administrative hearing
in accordance with Sections
120.569 and 120.57, F.S. The
petition must contain the in-
formation set forth below and
must be filed with (received
by) the Department's Agency
Clerk in the Office of General
Counsel of the Department of
Environmental Protection at
3900 Commonwealth Boule-
vard, Mail Station #35, Tal-
lahassee, Florida 32399-3000.
Petitions filed by any persons
other than those entitled to
written notice under Section
120.60(3), F.S., must be filed
within fourteen (14) days of
publication of this Public No-
tice or receipt of a written no-
tice, whichever occurs first.
Under Section 120.60(3), F.S.,
however, any person who
asked the Permitting Author-
ity for notice of agency action
may file a petition within four-
teen (14) days of receipt of
that notice, regardless of the
date of publication. A peti-
tioner shall mail a copy of the
petition to the applicant at the
address indicated above, at
the time of filing. The failure
of any person to file a petition
within the appropriate time
period shall constitute a waiver
of that person's right to re-
quest an administrative deter-
mination (hearing) under Sec-
tions 120.569 and 120.57,
F.S., or to intervene in this
proceeding and participate as
a party to it. Any subsequent
intervention will be only at
the approval of the presiding
officer upon the filing of a
motion in compliance with
Rule 28-106.205, F.A.C.

A petition that disputes the
material facts on which the
Permitting Authority's action
is based must contain the fol-
lowing information: (a) The
name and address of each
agency affected and each
agency's file or identification
number, if known; (b) The
name, address and telephone
number of the petitioner; the
name address and telephone
number of the petitioner's
representative, if any, which
shall be the address for serv-
ice purposes during the pro-
ceeding; and an explanation of how
the petitioner's substantial
rights will be affected by the
agency determination; (c) A
statement of how and when
the petitioner received notice
of the agency action or pro-
posed action; (d) A statement
of all disputed issues of ma-
terial fact. If there are none,
the petition must so state; (e)

A concise statement of the ul-
timate facts alleged, including
the specific facts the peti-
tioner contends warrant reversal
or modification of the agen-
cy's proposed action; (f) A
statement of the specific
rules or statutes the peti-
tioner contends require reversal
or modification of the agen-
cy's proposed action; and, (g)
A statement of the relief
sought by the petitioner, stat-
ing precisely the action the
petitioner wishes the agency
to take with respect to the
agency's proposed action. A
petition that does not dispute
the material facts upon which
the Permitting Authority's ac-
tion is based shall state that
no such facts are in dispute
and otherwise shall contain
the same information as set
forth above, as required by
Rule 28-106.301, F.A.C.
Because the administrative
hearing process is designed
to formulate final agency ac-
tion, the filing of a petition
means that the Permitting Au-
thority's final action may be
different from the position
taken by it in this Public No-
tice of Intent. Persons whose
substantial interests will be
affected by any such final
decision of the Permitting Au-
thority on the application
have the right to petition to
become a party to the pro-
ceeding, in accordance with
the requirements set forth
above.

Mediation: Mediation is not
available for this proceeding.
Objections: In addition to the
above right to petition, pur-
suant to 42 United States
Code (U.S.C.) Section
7661d(b)(2), any person may
petition the Administrator of
the EPA within sixty (60) days
of the expiration of the Ad-
ministrator's 45 (forty-five)
day review period as estab-
lished at 42 U.S.C. Section
7661d(b)(1), to object to the
issuance of any Permit. Any
petition shall be based only
on objections to the permit
that were raised with reason-
able specificity during the
thirty (30) day public com-
ment period provided in the
Public Notice, unless the peti-

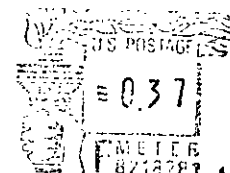
tioner demonstrates to the
Administrator of the EPA that
it was impracticable to raise
such objections within the
comment period or unless the
grounds for such objection
arose after the comment pe-
riod. Filing of a petition with
the Administrator of the EPA
does not stay the effective
date of any permit properly
issued pursuant to the provi-
sions of Chapter 62-213,
F.A.C. Petitions filed with the
Administrator of EPA must
meet the requirements of 42
U.S.C. Section 7661d(b)(2)
and must be filed with the Ad-
ministrator of the EPA at: U.S.
EPA, 401 M Street, S.W.,
Washington, D.C. 20460. For
