The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) gives notice of its intent to issue an Air Construction Permit to Sunter Cement Company to construct a greenfield portland cement plant in the City of Center Hill in Sunter County. A review under the rules for the Hill in Sunter County. A review under the rules for the Prevention of Significant Deterioration of Air Quality Prevention of Significant Deterioration of Air Quality (PSD) and Best Available Control Technology (BACT) determinations were required for nitrogen oxides (NOX) suffur dioxide (SO2), volatile organic compounds (VOC) carbon monoside (CO), and particulate matter (PM/PM10). The applicant's name and business address are Sumter Cement Company, LLC. Post Office 410, Branford, Florida 32008.

Sunter Cement Company (SCC) proposes to construct a dry process portional cement plant with a nominal capacity of 1.715.500 trans per year (IPY) of clinker the equipment will include a primary crusher and conveyance equipment to transport limestone to raw material storage, a raw material storage building for limestone and materials containing silical aluminal iron, and additives, stackers, rectainners and conveyance equipment to raw materials driving and milling: a hormogenizing silic a dry process preheater/colcinier (PH/C) kilin with In-line raw milli capable of producing 5.000 tons per day (IPD) of clinker, a clinker cooler, a coal and petroleum coke mill: conveyance equipment to clinker storage, conveyance equipment to the two finish mills, cement sitios and a truck loadout area, and a packhouse. Numerous baghouses will be included to contain dust from materials conveyance, transfer and honding. A single large bagnouse will serve exhaust from the PH/C kiln, raw mill, and clinker cooler.

The near necessary to convert the raw materials to clinker will be provided primarily by coal and peticle-um coke combustion in the man kiln curier and carcination burner. NOX emissions will be minimized by inconditional provided compositions of the calcurat, and a selective non-catalytic reduction (SNCR) ammonia injection system. SO2 emissions will controlled by use of inherently low suffur raw materials scrubbing by finely divided lime in the calcurate and hydrated lime in action system. CO and VCC emissions will be controlled by promoting complete combustion in the kin and calciner and minimizing carbon and only content of raw materials. PM/PM10 from the PH/C kiln, in-line raw mill, and clinker cooler will be controlled by bignouses. Emissions points from handling, conveyance, and transfer will be controlled by bignouses. Emissions from the controlled by reasonable precautions including playing, road sweeping, watering, planting grass etc.

The SCC Plant will be subject to the maximum achievable control technology (MACT) requirements in 40CFR63. Subpart LLL - National Emission Standards for Hazardaus All Pollutants for Portland Cement Manufacturing Industry in addition, the plant will be subject to the Department's determination of best available control technology (BACT). The BACT determinations for the PH/C kiln, whine calciner and cinker cooler are. 1.95 pounds of NOx per fon of clinker ((b/fan), 0.20 ib SO2/fon 2.9 lb CO/fon, 0.115 lb VOC/fon and 0.17 lb PM/PMI0/fon. The BACT determinations are among the lowest emission limitations among recent determinations in the state and the country.

Mercury (Hg) emissions will be limited to 184 pounds per year. Initially compliance will be conservatively estimated based on the concentration of Hg in the fuels and raw materials entering the process. The Department has determined that by the second year of operation, reliable mercury continuous emission manifors (Hg-CEMS) will be available and requires that a Hg-CEMS be installed to measure actual emissions. This instrument together with another planned in Sumfer County represent the first two Hg-CEMS installations required at any facility in the State of Flonda. They also represent the first two Hg-CEMS monifors required at cement plants in the United States.

The Department reviewed the applicant's ambient air audity analysis for CO NOx, SO2, VOC and PM/PM10, poliutants subject to PSD for this project. All poliutants were less than their respective Significant Impact Levels for the Class Il area (lie all areas except for the Class I Chassohowitza Wilderness Area). except for PM/PM10 on a 24-hour and annual basis. Therefore, a rehined increment modeling analysis, including nearby sources, was required for PM10. The results of this analysis are given in the lable below. This refined analysis demonstrated compliance with regulatory requirements which include demonstrating compliance with the ambient air quality standards.


