Project The applicant applied on May 19, 2009 to the De-partment for a Title V air operation permit renewal. This is a renewal of Title V air operation permit No. 1270028-007-AV. The existing facility consists of ten intermittent duty simple cycle combustion turbin-electrical genera-tors, fuel oil storage tanks and ancillary equipment.

Permitting Authority: Applications for Title V dir operation permits for facilities that operate Acid Rain units are subject to review in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 403, Florida Statutes (F.S.) and Chapters 624, 62-210, 62-213 and 62-214, of the Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.). The proposed project is not exempt from air permitting requirements and a Title V air operation permit is required to operate the facility. The Bureau of Air Regulation is the Permitting Authority responsible for making a permit determination for this project. PA Review: EPA has agreed to treat the draft/proposed Title V air operation permit as a proposed Title V oir operation permit and to perform its 45-day review provided by the law and regulations concurrently with the public comment period. Although EPA's 45-day review period will be performed concurrently with the public comment period, the deadline for submitting a citizen petition to object to the EPA Administrator will be determined as if EPA's 45-day review period is performed offer the public comment period has ended. The final Title V air operation permit will be issued after the conclusion of the 45-day EPA review period so long as no adverse comments are received that result in a different decision or significant change of terms or conditions. Any petition shall be based only on objections to the permit that were raised with reasonable specificity during the 30-day public comment period provided in the Public Notice, unless the pe

It was impracticable to raise such objections within the comment period or unless the grounds for such objection arose after the comment period. Filing of a perition with the Administrator of the EPA does not stay the effective date of any permit properly issued pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 62-213, FA.C.
