# Homeowners worry new Sea Ray plant. will give off odor

MERRITT ISLAND Barney Clary wants Sea Ray to guarantee that the production of its million-dollar speed boats doesn't put a bad odor in the air surrounding his quarter-milliondollar home just south of the company's new plant.

"What's going to be the issue is the smell," Clary said of Sea Ray's \$16 million plant. (1997)

'-⊰ Neighbors are starting to • focus more on the odor, which has been an issue with the company's existing plant, now that concerns about hazardous emissions have been allayed.

"I don't want that smell when." I'm sitting by the pool," said Clary, president of the Island Crossings homeowners' associa-

on. The company is looking at ways to reduce the odor, its officials say, but its first priority is making sure neighbors know the plant won't pose a health hazard.

What has particularly concerned neighbors and environmentalists was the new plant's increased output of styrene, a sweet-smelling liquid used in boat manufacturing that's been linked to neurological damage. ,

Sea Ray has promised to spend \$1 million installing and operating technology designed to reduce such emissions by: about half.


### **DEP Section 11(b):**

### REQUEST FOR EXTENSION OF TIME

By and through undersigned counsel, Sea Ray Boats, Inc. (Sea Ray) hereby requests, pursuant to Florida Administrative Code Rule 62-110.106(4), an Extension of Time, to and including January 28, 2000, in which to file a Petition for Administrative Proceedings in the above-styled matter. As good cause for granting this request, Sea Ray states the following:

- 1. On or about October 8, 1999, Sea Ray received from the Department of Environmental Protection (Department) an "Intent to Issue Air Construction Permit" (Permit No. 0090093-003-AC, PSD-FL-274) for the proposed Cape Canaveral Plant to be located in Brevard County, Florida. Along with the Intent to Issue, Sea Ray received a proposed Air Construction Permit and "Public Notice of Intent to Issue Air Construction Permit."
- 2. Sea Ray received from the Department an extension of time through and including January 14, 2000, by order dated December 27, 1999.
- 3. The proposed permit and associated documents contain several provisions that warrant clarification, correction, or revision.
- 4. Representatives of Sea Ray have corresponded and intend to continue to correspond with staff of the Department's Bureau of Air Regulation in an effort to resolve all issues.
- 5. This request is filed simply as a protective measure to avoid waiver of Sea Ray's right to challenge certain conditions contained in the proposed permit. Grant of this

request will not prejudice either party, but will further their mutual interest and likely avoid the need to file a petition and proceed to a formal administrative hearing.

- A representative of Sea Ray has contacted Clair Fancy with the Department's 6. Bureau of Air Regulation to discuss Sea Ray's request for an extension of time until January 28, 2000, and he has no objection.
- Counsel for Sea Ray has attempted without success to contact Douglas Beason 7. with the Department's Office of General Counsel regarding this request.

WHEREFORE, Sea Ray respectfully requests that the time for filing of a Petition for Administrative Proceedings in regard to the Department's Intent to Issue Air Construction Permit for Permit No. 0090093-003-AC, PSD-FL-274 be formally extended to and including January 28, 2000. If the Department denies this Request, Sea Ray requests the opportunity to file a Petition for Administrative Proceedings within 10 days of such denial.

Dear Mr. Thompson:

This letter follows my site visit today to the referenced site that is under construction. I met with Steve Builder and have spoken with Fete Cantelou regarding my findings. The District received a call from John Royal of the Brevard County Stormwater Division regarding an alleged turbidity violation. Upon inspecting the excavated test basin opening to the barge canal today, I found that the side slopes of the basin entrance are under construction, not stabilized, and are not bordered with adequate floating turbidity control devices. Mr. Cantelou indicated today that he would install a portion of the floating barrier today and finish the installation along both sides of the basin entrance tomorrow. Upon completion, please fax written confirmation that this has been accomplished. Direct the fax (# 407-722-5357) to Janice Unger, Compliance Manager.

Upon reviewing the plans, it appears that the proposed rock revetment—which you have said will be installed along the shoreling entrance to the test basin—is not on the District's approved plans. As I discussed with Mr. Cantelou, please fax us the construction plans for the reverment by 4pm Monday, December 20, 1999. District staff will review the plan and send you written verification of approval or necessary revisions.

Considering the amount of barge canal water displaced each time a barge passes through the canal, it is imperative that the revelment is constructed as soon as possible. Per Mr. Cantelou, the 3-foot-high water displacement and wave action from the barges will likely dislodge the floating barrier upon each barge passing. The wave action against the unstabilized shoreline is resulting in apparent turbidity violations. The turbidity has reportedly extended into the Banana River, which is an aquatic preserve. It appears that the only way to abate the water quality violations is to construct the revetment as soon as possible. Considering the unlikelyhood of a turbidity control device that will remain in place and function as designed, you will need to complete construction of the revetment within 10 days of the District faxing you
