Facility Location: JEA operates the Brandy Branch Generating Station, which is located in Duval County, at 15701 Beaver Street West, Baldwin City.

Project: The applicant has submitted a complete and certified Clean Air Interstate Rule (CAIR) Part Form and has requested its incorporation into the existing Title V air operation permit. Details of the project are provided in the application and the enclosed Statement of Basis.

The existing facility consists of the following emissions units:

Three dual-fuel, nominal 170 megawatt (MW) General Electric model PG7241FA combustion turbine-electrical generators and two one-million gallon capacity fuel oil storage tanks. Two of the combustion turbines (EU-002 and EU-003) are configured for combined cycle mode and one (EU-001) for simple cycle operation. Emissions from the units are controlled by Dry Low Nitrogen Oxides (NO_X) (DLN-2.6) combustors when operating on natural gas and wet injection when firing fuel oil. For the combined cycle units, selective catalytic reduction (SCR) systems are additionally utilized for further NO_X reductions. Inherently clean fuels and good combustion practices are employed to control all pollutants.

The facility is subject to all applicable provisions of Chapter 403, Florida Statutes, and Florida Administrative Code Chapters 62-4, 62-204, 62-210, 62-212, 62-213, 62-214, 62-296, 62-297; and the applicable requirements of the Code of Federal Regulations Section 40, Parts 60, 72, 73, and 75. The facility holds ORIS code 7846 under Phase II of the Federal Acid Rain Program.

Permitting Authority: Applications for Title V air operation permits are subject to review in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 403, Florida Statutes (F.S.) and Chapters 62-4, 62-210, 62-213, 62-214 and 62-296.470 of the Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.). The Bureau of Air Regulation is the Permitting Authority responsible for making a permit determination for this project. Petitions filed by the applicant or any of the parties listed below must be filed within 14 days of receipt of this Written Notice of Intent to Issue Air Permit. Petitions filed by any persons other than those entitled to written notice under Section 120.60(3), F.S., must be filed within 14 days of publication of the attached Public Notice or within 14 days of receipt of this Written Notice of Intent to Issue Air Permit, whichever occurs first. Under Section 120.60(3), F.S., however, any person who asked the Permitting Authority for notice of agency action may file a petition within 14 days of receipt of that notice, regardless of the date of publication. A petitioner shall mail a copy of the petition to the applicant at the address indicated above, at the time of filing. The failure of any person to file a petition within the appropriate time period shall constitute a waiver of that person's right to request an administrative determination (hearing) under Sections 120.569 and 120.57, F.S., or to intervene in this proceeding and participate as a party to it. If there are none, the petition must so indicate; (e) A concise statement of the ultimate facts alleged, including the specific facts the petitioner contends warrant reversal or modification of the agency's proposed action; (f) A statement of the specific rules or statutes the petitioner contends require reversal or modification of the agency's proposed action including an explanation of how the alleged facts relate to the specific rules or statutes; and, (g) A statement of the relief sought by the petitioner, stating precisely the action the petitioner wishes the agency to take with respect to the agency's proposed action.

EPA Review: EPA has agreed to treat the draft/proposed Title V air operation permit as a proposed Title V air operation permit and to perform its 45-day review provided by the law and regulations concurrently with the public comment period. Although EPA's 45-day review period will be performed concurrently with the public comment period, the deadline for submitting a citizen petition to object to the EPA Administrator will be determined as if EPA's 45-day review period is performed after the public comment period has ended. The final Title V air operation permit will be issued after the conclusion of the 45-day EPA review period so long as no adverse comments are received that results in a different decision or significant change of terms or conditions. 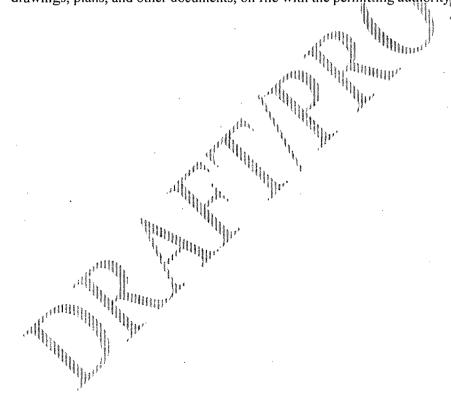

(1) The owners and operators of the source and each CAIR NO $_{\star}$ Ozone Season unit at the source shall surrender the CAIR NO $_{\star}$ Ozone Season allowances required for deduction under 40 CFR 98.354(d)(1) and pay any fine, penalty, or assessment or comply with any other remedy imposed, for the same violations, under the Clean Air Act or applicable state law; and

(2) Each ton of such excess emissions and each day of such control period shall constitute a separate violation of 40 CFR Part 96, Subpart AAAA, the Clean Air Act, and applicable state law.

Recordkeeping and Reporting Requirements

(1) Unless otherwise provided, the owners and operators of the CAIR NO_X Ozone Season source and each CAIR NO_X Ozone Season unit at this (1) Unless otherwise provided, the owners and operators of the CAIR NO₄ Ozone Season source and each CAIR NO₄ Ozone Season unit at this source shall keep on site at the source each of the following documents for a period of 5 years from the date the document is created. This period may be extended for cause, at any time before the end of 5 years, in whiting by the DEP or the Administrator.

(i) The certificate of representation under 40 CFR 96.315 for the CAIR designated representative for the source and all documents that demonstrate the truth of the statements in the certificate of representation; provided that the

certificate and documents shall be retained on site at the source beyond such 5-year period until such documents are superseded because of the

(ii) All emissions monitoring information, in accordance with 40 CFR 9at 96, Subpart HHHH, of this part, provided that to the extent that 40 CFR Part 96, Subpart HHHH, provided so a 3-year period for recordkeeping, the 3-year period shall apply.

(iii) Copies of all reports, compliance certifications, and other submissions and all records made or required under the CAIR NO₄ Ozone

Season Trading Program.

(iv) Copies of all documents used to complete a CAIR Part form and any other submission under the CAIR NO₄ Ozone Season Trading Program or to demonstrate compliance with the requirements of the CAIR NO₅ Ozone Season Trading Program.

(2) The CAIR designated representative of a CAIR NO₅ Ozone Season source and each CAIR NO₇ Ozone Season unit at the source shall submit the reports required under the CAIR NO₇ Ozone Season Trading Program, including those under 40 CFR Part 98, Subpart HHHH.

Liability

- (1) Each CAIR NO, Ozone Season source and each CAIR NO, Ozone Season unit shall meet the requirements of the CAIR NO, Ozone Season Trading Program
- (2) Any provision of the CAIR NO. Ozone Season Trading Program that applies to a CAIR NO. Ozone Season source or the CAIR designated representative of a CAIR NO , Ozone Season source shall also apply to the owners and operators of such source and of the CAIR NO, Ozone
- Season units at the source.

 (3) Any provision of the CAIR NO₂ Ozone Season Trading Program that applies to a CAIR NO₂ Ozone Season unit or the CAIR designated representative of a CAIR NOv Ozone Season unit shall also apply to the owners and operators of such unit.

Effect on Other Authorities.

No provision of the CAIR NO_x Ozone Season Trading Program, a CAIR Part, or an exemption under 40 CFR 96.305 shall be construed as exempting or excluding the owners and operators, and the CAIR designated representative, of a CAIR NO_x Ozone Season source or CAIR NO_x. Ozone Season unit from compliance with any other provision of the applicable, approved Stato Implomentation Plan, a federaty enforceable
