The Department of Environmental Protection (permitting outhority) gives notice of its intent to issue a Title V oir operation permit to Tampa Electric Company for the F.J. Gannon Stration located at Port Sutton Road, Tampa, Hillsborough County. This permit incorporates the Phase II NOx standards into the Title IV Acid Rain Part pursuant to Rule 62-214.360(6), Florido Administrative Code (F.A.C.). The applicant's name and address are: Tampa Electric Company, P.O. Box 111, Tampa, Florida 33601-0111.
The permitting outhority will issue the Title V PROPOSED
Permit, and subsequent Title V FINAL Permit, in accordance with the conditions of the Title V Revised DRAFT
Permit unless a response received in accordance with the following procedures results in a different decision or significant change of terms or conditions.

following procedures results in a different decision or significant change of terms or conditions. The permitting authority will accept written comments concerning the proposed Title V Revised DRAFT Permit issuance action for a period of 30 (thirty) days from the date of publication of this Notice. Written comments should be provided to the Department's Bureau of Air Regulaction, 2600 Bidir Stone Road, Mail Station #5505, Taliahassee, Florida 32399-2400. Any written comments filed shall be made available for public inspection. If written comments received result in a significant change in this Title V Revised DRAFT Permit, the permitting authority shall issue another Title V Revised DRAFT Permit and require, if applicable, another Public Notice.

A person whose substantial interests are affected by the proposed permitting decision may petition for an administrative hearing in occordance with Sections 120.569 ; and

proposed permitting decision may petition for an administrative hearing in accordance with Sections 120.569 and 120,57 of the Florida Statutes (F.S.). The petition must contain the information set forth below and must be filled (received) in the Office of General Counsel of the Department of Environmental Protection, 3900 Commonwealth Boulevard, Mail Station #25, Taliohassee, Florida 32399-3000 (Telephone: 850/488-9730; Fax: 850/487-938). Petitions filed by any persons other than those entitled to written notice under Section 120.60(3), F.S., must be filled within fourteen days of publication of the public notice or within four-F.S., must be filed within four-teen days of publication of the public notice or within four-teen days of receipt of the notice of intent, whichever occurs first. Under Section 120.6033, F.S., however, any person who asked the permitting authority for notice of agency action may file a petition within fourteen days of receipt of that notice, repardless of the date of publication. A petitioner shall mail a copy of the petition to the applicant at the address indicated above, of the time of filing. The fallure of any person to file a petition within the applicable time period shall constitute a waiver of that person's right to request an administrative determination (hearing) under Sections 120.569 and 120.57, F.S., or to intervene in this proceeding and participate as a party to it. Any subsequent intervention will be only at the appropriate of

Because the administrative hearing process is designed to formulate final agency action, the filling of a petition means that the permitting authority's final action may be different. find action may be different from the position taken by it in this notice of intent. Per-sons whose substantial inter-ests will be affected by any such final decision of the per-

sons whose substantial interests will be affected by any such final decision of the permitting outhority on the capilization have the right to partition to become a party to the proceeding, in accordance with the requirements set forth above.

Medicition is not available for this proceeding.

In addition to the above, pursuant to 42 United States Code (U.S.C.) Section 7661d(b)(2), any person may petition the Administrator of the EPA within 60 (sixty) days of the expiration of the Administrator's 45 (forty-five) day review period as established at 42 U.S.C. Section 7661d(b)(1), to object to issuance of any permit. Any petition shall be based only on objections to the permit that were raised with reasonable specificity during the 30 (thirty) day public comment period provided in this notice, unless the petitioner demonstrates to the Administrator of the EPA that it was impracticable to raise such objections within the comment period or unless the grounds for such objection arose after the comment period. Filing of a petition with the Administrator of the EPA does not stay the effective date of any permit property issued pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 62-213, FA.C. Petitions filed with the Administrator of EPA must meet the requirements of 42 U.S.C. Section 7661d(b)(2) and must be filed with the Administrator of the EPA at: U.S. EPA, 401 M Street, S.W., Washington, D.C. 20460.
