The existing facility consists four (4) 56.7 MW Pratt & Whitney (model number FT4C-ILF) fuel Pratt & Whitney (model number FT4C-1LF) fuel oil-fired combustion turbine-electrical generators and ancilliary equipment. These units started operation in 1973 and operate in a peaking mode. This facility may also include relocatable diesel generator(s) with a maximum (combined) heat input of 25.74 MMBtu/hour and with a maximum (combined) rating of 2460 kilowatts. Emissions at this acility are uncontrolled. There are no Acid Rain Emissions Units at this acility. This facility is subject to applicable brovisions of Chapters 52-4, 62-204, 62-210, 62-212, 62-213, 62-256, 62-257, 62-281, 62-296, and 62-297, F.A.C.

Facility Location: The applicant operates a Power Electric Utility, which is located at 13th Ave. & 2nd 5t. South, St. Petersburg, Pinellas County.

Project: On January 18, 2005 (complete on April 11, 2005) the applicant applied to the Permitting Authority for a Title V Permit revision to include the later version of ASTM Method D 1552. There will be no physical construction or emissions ncreases as a result of this project.

The applicant requested the revision of the facility Title V Operation Permit to incorporate the following language: "ASTM D1552-90 or later editions" to the list of acceptable fuel oil tests methods in Section III. Specific Conditions A.13 and B.11. A later edition of this method (ASTM D1552-95) is referenced in Rule 62-297.440(1)(m) F.A.C. Rule F.A.C.

There will be no physical construction or emissions increases as a result of this project. Details of the project are provided in the application and the enclosed "Statement of Basis".

Notice of Intent to Issue Air Permit: The Permitting Authority gives notice of its intent to issue a Title V Air Operation Permit Revision to the applicant for the project described above. The applicant has provided reasonable assurance that operation of the facility will not adversely impact air quality and that the project will comply with all appropriate provisions of Chapters 62-4, 62-204, 62-210, 62-212, 62-213, 62-256, 62-257, 62-281, 62-296, and 62-297, F.A.C. The Permitting Authority will issue a Proposed Permit and subsequent final Permit in accordance with the conditions of the Draft Permit unless a response received in accordance with the following procedures results in a different decision or a significant change of terms or conditions.

Comments: The Permitting Authority will accept written comments concerning the DRAFT Title V Air Operation Permittor a period of thirty (30) days from the date of publication of this Public Notice. Written comments must be post-marked, and all e-mail or facsimile comments must be preceived by the close of business (5 pm), on or before the end of this 30-day period by the Permitting Authority at the above address, email or facsimile. As part of his or her comments, any person may also request that the Permitting Authority hold a public meeting on this permitting authority hold publish notice of the time, date, and location on the Department's official web site for notices (http://thoraf.dep. state.fl.us/onw/) and in a newspaper of general circulation in the address or phone number. If written comments or comments received at a public meeting result in a significant change to the DRAFT Permit, the Permitting Authority shall revise the DRAFT Permit and require if applicable another Public Notice. All comments filed will be made available for public inspection.

Petitions: A person whose substantial interests are affected by the proposed permitting decision may petition for an administrative hearing in accordance with Sections 120,569 and 120,57, F.S. The petition must contain the information set forth below and must be filed with (received by) the Department's Agency Clerk in the Office of General Counsel of the Department's Agency Clerk in the Office of General Counsel of the Department's Agency Clerk in the Office of General Counsel of the Department at 3900 Commonwealth Boulevard, Mail Station #35, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-3000. Petitions filed by any persons other than those entitled to written notice under Section 120,60(3), F.S. must be filed within fourteen (14) days of publication of this Public Notice or receipt of a written notice, whichever occurs first, Under Section 120,60(3), F.S., however, any person who asked the Permitting Authority for notice of agency action may file a petition within fourteen (14) days of receipt of that notice, regardless of the date of publication. A petitioner shall mail a copy of the petition to the applicant at the address indicated above, at the time of filing. The failure of any person to file a petition within the appropriate time period shall constitute a waiver of that person's right to request an administrative determination (hearing) under Sections 120,559 and 120,57, F.S., or to intervene in this proceeding and participate as a party to it. A petition that does not dispute the material facts upon which the Permitting Authority's action is based shall state that no such facts are in dispute and otherwise shall contain the same information as set forth above, as required by Rule 28-106.301, F.A.C.

Be cause the administrative hearing process is designed to formulate final agency action, the filing of a petition means that the Permitting Authority's final action may be different from the position taken by it in this Public Notice of intent. Persons whose substantial interests will be affected by any such final decision of the Permitting Authority on the application have the right to petition to become a party to the proceeding, in accordance with the requirements set forth above.

Mediation: Mediation is not available for this proceeding.

Objections: In addition to the above right to petition, pursuant to 42 United states Code (U.S.C.) Section 7661d(b)(2), any person may petition the Administrator of the EPA within sixty (60) days of the expiration of 12 the

Any petition shall be based only on objections to the permit that were raised with reasonable specificity during the thirty (30) day public comment period provided in the Public Notice, unless the petitioner demonstrates to the Administrator of the EPA that it was impracticable to raise such objections within the comment period or unless the grounds for such objection arose after the comment period, filing of a petition with the Administrator of the EPA does not stay the effective date of any permit properly issued pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 62-213, F.A.C. Petitions filed with the Administrator of EPA must meet the requirements of 42 U.S.C. Section 7661d(b)(2) and must be filed with the Administrator of the EPA at U.S.EPA 401 M Street, S.W., Washington, D.C. 20460.
