



Cote, Chief Executive Officer, on 9/26/09, do hereby sub-delegate to the individuals occupying the positions of Vice President of Integrated Supply Chain, Vice President of OEM Manufacturing, Vice President of Aftermarket Services and Product Center Vice Presidents:

(a) with concurrence from the Law Department and the Vice President of Health Safety & Environment, the authority to compromise or settle a claim, lawsuit, order, demand, investigation or other proceeding that has been or may be asserted by or against the Corporation involving a private party or governmental authority or to other environmental issues and to execute for and in the name of Corporation consent decrees, administrative consent orders and other agreements or documents involving up to \$100,000, which authority may not be further sub-delegated; and
