Facility Location: The applicant owns and operates the existing Mulberry Cogeneration Facility, which is located in Polk County at 3600 County Road 555 in Bartow, Florida Facility Description: The facility consists of a 126 megawatt combined cycle cogeneration unit, including one General Electric Model PG7111EA combustion turbine, one heat recovery steam generator, one steam turbine-electric generator one Foster Wheeler Limited 99 MMBtu/hr secondary boiler, one 175 horsepower emergency fire pumpand ancillary equipment. The combustion turbine is primarily fired with natural gas. New No. 2 fuel oil is used as backup.

Project: The applicant applied on May 21, 2014 to the Department for an air construction permit to replace the original combustion turbine ammonia-based inlet air refrigeration system with a water-based evaporative cooling system.
