Enclosed are ADMINISTRATIVELY CORRECTED pages to the Title V Air Operation Permit, No.: 0110048-003-AV, for the operation of the Spangler Terminal located at 909 SE 24th Street, Fort Lauderdale, Broward County, Florida. This correction is issued pursuant to Rule 62-210.360, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.), and Chapter 403, Florida Statutes (F.S.). This change is made at the applicant's request dated April 27, 2005, to transfer ownership of the Sprangler Terminal from Motiva Enterprises LLC to Marathon Ashland Petroleum LLC. The effective date of sale or legal transfer is June 1, 2005. This corrective action does not alter the effective dates of the existing permit.

The Environmental Protection Department (EPD) will consider the above-noted action final unless a timely petition for an administrative hearing is filed pursuant to Sections 120.569 and 120.57, F.S. Mediation under Section 120.573, F.S., will not be available for this proposed action.

A person whose substantial interests are affected by the proposed permitting decision may petition for an administrative hearing in accordance with Sections 120.569 and 120.57, F.S. The petition must contain the information set forth below and must be filed (received) by the Clerk of the Broward County Attorney Office, 115 South Andrews Avenue, Room 423, Fort Lauderdale, Florida 33301. Petitions filed by the permit applicant or any of the parties listed below must be filed within 14 (fourteen) days of receipt of this notice. Petitions filed by any other person must be filed within 14 (fourteen) days of receipt of this proposed action. A petitioner must mail a copy of the petition to the applicant at the address indicated above, at the time of filing. The failure of any person to file a petition within the appropriate time period shall constitute a waiver of that person's right to request an administrative determination (hearing) under Sections 120.569 and 120.57, F.S., or to intervene in this proceeding and participate as a party to it. Any subsequent intervention will be only at the approval of the presiding officer upon the filing of a motion in compliance with Rule 28-106.205, F.A.C.

A petition must contain the following information:

- (a) The name and address of each agency affected and each agency's file or identification number, if known;
- (b) The name, address, and telephone number of the petitioner; the name, address and telephone number of the petitioner's representative, if any, which shall be the address for service purposes during the course of the proceeding; and an explanation of how the petitioner's substantial interests will be affected by the agency determination;
- (c) A statement of how and when each petitioner received notice of the agency action or proposed action;
- (d) A statement of all disputed issues of material fact. If there are none, the petition must so indicate;

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
- (e) A concise statement of the ultimate facts alleged, as well as the rules and statutes which entitle the petitioner to relief;
- (f) A statement of the specific rules or statutes the petitioner contends require reversal or modification of the agency's proposed action; and,
- (g) A statement of the relief sought by the petitioner, stating precisely the action petitioner wishes the agency to take with respect to the agency's proposed action.

A petition that does not dispute the material facts upon which the permitting authority's action is based shall state that no such facts are in dispute and otherwise shall contain the same information as set forth above, as required by Rule 28-106.301, F.A.C.

Because the administrative hearing process is designed to formulate final agency action, the filing of a petition means that the permitting authority's final action may be different from the position taken by it in this notice. Persons whose substantial interests will be affected by any such final decision of the permitting authority on the application have the right to petition to become a party to the proceeding, in accordance with the requirements set forth above.

Any party to this order (permit) has the right to seek judicial review of it under Section 120.68, F.S., by the filing of a Notice of Appeal, under Rule 9.110 of the Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure, with the Clerk of the Broward County Attorney Office, 115 South Andrews Avenue, Room 423, Fort Lauderdale, Florida 33301, and by filing a copy of the Notice of Appeal accompanied by the applicable filing fees with the appropriate District Court of Appeal. The Notice of Appeal must be filed within thirty days from the date this notice is filed with the clerk of the permitting authority.

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

The initial Title V Air Operation Permit, No. 0110048-001-AV, was effective on December 18, 1997. This Title V Air Operation Permit Renewal is issued under the provisions of Chapter 403, Florida Statutes (F.S.), and Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.) Chapters 62-4, 62-210 and 62-213. The above named permittee is hereby authorized to operate the facility shown on the application and approved drawing(s), plans, and other documents, attached hereto or on file with the permitting authority, in accordance with the terms and conditions of this permit.

The subject of this permit is the renewal of the initial Title V Air Operation Permit, No. 0110048-001-AV.

This facility consists of a bulk gasoline terminal with a loading rack with a vapor recovery system, gasoline storage tanks, additive tanks, and petroleum contact water tanks. Compliance Assurance Monitoring (CAM) applies to the Loading Rack.

Also included in this permit are miscellaneous insignificant emissions units and/or activities.

Based on the Title V Air Operation Permit application received June 3, 2002, the facility would retain their status as a synthetic source of hazardous air pollutants (HAPs) by operating within a self-imposed fuel throughput limits.

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**Section I: Facility Information.**

**Subsection A. Facility Description.**

The Motiva North facility is a bulk petroleum terminal located at Port Everglades in Broward County. On September 1, 1998, there was a change in ownership from Shell Oil Products Company to Motiva Enterprises LLC; and on June 1, 2005 the ownership changed to Marathon Ashland Petroleum LLC. The facility name was also changed to Spangler Terminal.

Petroleum products are received at the facility via marine vessels and held in storage tanks. The petroleum products are transferred from the storage tanks to tank trucks through the loading rack. Vapors containing volatile organic compounds (VOC) that are displaced during tank truck loading operations are routed to the vapor recovery unit (VRU) for capture. The recovered product is piped back to the storage tanks. Other significant sources of VOC emissions include: working and breathing losses from storage tanks, and fugitive emissions from pumps, valves, flanges, and vessel unloading.

Based on the Title V Air Operation Permit application received June 3, 2002, the facility is not a major source of hazardous air pollutants (HAPs).
