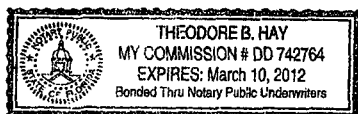

Power and Light
(FPL) Company, 700

Facility Location:
The applicant
operates the Turkey
Point Fossil Plant that
is located
approximately 9.5
miles east of Florida
City at 9700 SW
34th Street,
Miami-Dade County,
Florida 33156.

Project: The
applicant applied on
July 7, 2008 to the
Department for a Title
V air operation permit
renewal. The
renewal of Title V air
operation permit No.
0250003-01 AV.

The Turkey Point Title
V sources is
composed of two
separate co-located
power plants: the
Fossil Plant and the
Nuclear Plant. The
operations at the
Nuclear Plant are
addressed in a
separate Title V
permit, No.
0250003-010 AV.

The Turkey Point
Fossil Plant includes
two residual fuel oil
and natural
gas-fueled 440 MW
fossil fuel steam
electrical generators
(Units 1 and 2) with
low nitrogen oxides
burners and
mechanical cyclone
dust collectors. It
also includes a 150
MW gas turbine
generator. Unit 5
consists of four 170
MW gas turbine-
electrical
generator sets, four
heat recovery steam
generators, and
single 470 MW steam
turbine generator.
Unit 5 uses a
selective catalytic
reduction (SCR)
system with
ammonia injection
in conjunction with
Dry Low NOx
(gas firing) and wet
injection (oil firing)
to control NOx
emissions.

The fossil plant also
includes certain small
sources including five
fuel oil-fired black
start 2.75 MW diesel
generators, supporting
Units 1 and 2, one storage
tank, a mechanical
draft cooling tower,
and two emergency
diesel generators,
supporting Units 5
and several other
unregulated or
ineligible units.

This permitting action
addresses only the
operations at the
Turkey Point Fossil
Plant and does not
include the Turkey
Point Nuclear Plant
licensed by the
Nuclear Regulatory
Commission (NRC).

Permitting Authority:
Applications for Title
V air operation
permits are subject to
review in accordance
with the provisions of
Chapter 403, Florida
Statutes (F.S.) and
Chapters 62-1,
62-210, 62-213 and
62-214 of the Florida
Administrative Code
(F.A.C.). The
proposed project is
not exempt from air
permitting
requirements and a
Title V air operation
permit is required to
operate the facility.
The Bureau of Air
Regulation is the
Permitting Authority
responsible for
making a permit
determination for this
project. The
Permitting

Permitting
Authority gives
notice of its intent to
issue an air permit to
the applicant for the
project described
above. The applicant
has provided
reasonable
assurance that
continued operation
of existing equipment
will not adversely
impact air quality and
that the project will
comply with all
applicable
provisions of
Chapters 62-1,
62-210, 62-213,
62-214, 62-296 and
62-297, F.A.C. The
Permitting Authority
will issue a proposed
Title V permit and
subsequent final Title
V permit in
accordance with the
conditions of the
draft permit unless a
timely petition for an
administrative
hearing is filed under
Sections 120.569 and
120.57, F.S. or unless
public comment
received in
accordance with this
notice results in a
different decision of
a significant change of
terms or conditions.

Comments: The
Permitting Authority
will accept written
comments
concerning the Draft
Title V Permit for a
period of 30 days
from the day of
publication of the
Notice. Written
comments must be
received by the close
of business (5:00
p.m.) on or before
the end of this 30-day
period by the
Permitting Authority
at the above address.

As part of his or her
responsibility, any
person may also
request that the
Permitting Authority
hold a public meeting
on this permitting
action. If the
Permitting Authority
determines there is
sufficient interest for
a public meeting, it
will publish notice of
the time, date, and
location in the Florida
Administrative
Weekly (FAW). If a
public meeting is
conducted by the
Permitting Authority,
any oral and written
comments received
during the public
meeting will also be
considered by the
Permitting Authority.
If timely received
written comments or
comments received
at a public meeting
result in a significant
change to the Draft
Permit, the
Permitting Authority
shall issue a Revised
Draft Permit and
requires, if applicable,
another Public
Notice. Subsequent
action on the Title V
and Title IV parts
of the renewal permit
may be split if
comments are
received on the Title
V portion of the draft
permit. All comments
filed will be made
available for public
inspection. For
additional

Petitions: A person
whose substantial
interests are affected
by the proposed
permitting decision
may petition for an
administrative
hearing in
accordance with
Sections 120.569 and
120.57, F.S. The
petition must contain
the information set
forth below and must
be filed with (received
by) the Department's
Administrative Clerk in the
Office of General
Counsel of the
Department of
Environmental
Protection at 3900
Commonwealth
Boulevard, Mail
Station #35,
Tallahassee, Florida
32309-3000.
Petitions filed by any
persons other than
those entitled to
written notice under
Section 120.60(3)
F.S. must be filed
within 14 days of
publication of the
Public Notice or
receipt of a written
notice, whichever
occurs first. Under
Section 120.60(3),
F.S., however, any
person who asked the
Permitting Authority
for notice of agency
action may file a
petition within 14
days of receipt of that
notice, regardless of
the date of
publication. A
petitioner shall mail a
copy of the petition to
the applicant at the
address indicated
above, at the time of
filing. The failure of
any person to file a
petition within the
appropriate time
period shall
constitute a waiver of
that person's right to
request an
administrative
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petitioner shall mail a
copy of the petition to
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address indicated
above, at the time of
filing. The failure of
any person to file a
petition within the
appropriate time
period shall
constitute a waiver of
that person's right to
request an
administrative
determination.

Mediation: Mediation,
is not available for
this proceeding.

Objections: Finally,
pursuant to 42 United
States Code (U.S.C.),
Section 7661d(b)(2),
any person may
petition the
Administrator of the
EPA within 60 days of
the expiration of the
Administrative Clerk's
45-day review period
as established at 42
U.S.C. Section 7661d
(b)(1), to object to
the issuance of any
Title V air operation
permit. Any petition
shall be based only
on objections to the
Permit that were
raised with
reasonable specificity
during the public
comment
period provided in
the Public Notice,
unless the petitioner
demonstrates to the
Administrator of the
EPA that it was
impracticable to raise
such objections
within the comment
period or unless the
grounds for such
objection arose after
the comment period.
Filing of a petition
with the
Administrator of the
EPA does not stay
the effective date of
any permit properly
issued pursuant to
the provisions of
Chapter 62-213,
F.A.C. Petitions filed
with the
Administrator of EPA
must meet the
requirements of 42-
U.S.C. Section
7661d(b)(2) and must
be filed with the
Administrator of the
EPA at: U.S. EPA,
401 M Street, S.W.,
Washington, D.C.
